One day, hopefully, we will be able to get organized with some volunteers to work along with the city to make our town more visually attractive with new, sustainable, shade giving trees, shrubs and lots of flowers.

It was a breath of fresh air when I recently read an article in the Medford "Mail Tribune" that our new Sheriff, Mike Winters, was quoted as being very careful about the public's civil rights, especially when it involves forfeiture of assets. Winters states that property will not be seized unless there is an arrest and conviction. Jackson County law enforcement seems to finally be headed in the right direction.
