building was canceled.

This marks the second time residents have attempted to transform the school into a community center since TRSD closed it at the end of the 2000 school year to cut costs.

Such an effort, Hunt said, requires an immense amount of effort and commitment to be successful.

Hunt definitely exhibits those qualities, said board of directors member Jan Walker, who has lived in Selma for more than three years.

"Bill has a huge amount of energy," she said.

The center, Hunt said, will not only inform residents about what is going on in Selma specifically, and the valley in general, and provide a community meeting place, but will also strive to promote Selma tourism as well.

Anyone -- participants don't have to live in Selma -- is welcome to suggest an idea for the center as long as it is safe, Walker said.

The main desire is to incorporate the diversity of each individual in the community into all areas of the center.

"So no one feels left out," Tennity said.

That the organization is not affiliated with any one church, school or club, will hopefully help residents feel comfortable participating in center programs and events, Hunt said.

There has already been a strong showing of support for the center, Hunt added.

During the first general planning meeting on July 14, dozens of people either volunteered to help out the group or signed a petition supporting the center.

Another general meeting is scheduled on Monday, Aug. 18 at 7 p.m. at the center.

The fun part of it all, Bill said, will be watching the center grow and evolve.

"Where we go is really going to be the exciting part of it," Hunt said.

said. "Our focus is keeping people's quality of life the highest we can."

Not just a place where people can pick up pamphlets to take home and read -- although literature is available -- the goal of the center is to create a safe environment where individuals and families feel comfortable coming in to ask questions and talk one-on-one with the volunteers about how hospice care might help them and their loved ones.

All information given to the volunteers is confidential, noted Bill Shiery, who has volunteered for eight years.

A visit to the center doesn't automatically mean an individual must then receive hospice care. It is the first step in the information-gathering process.

Once interest in Lovejoy care has been noted, a volunteer will take down the appropriate information and a referral will be made. The interested person or party can then contact the Grants Pass office, or someone from the office will contact them at their request.

"(Lovejoy) doesn't turn anyone away," Shiery said.

Individual donations and a donation from The James F. and Marion L. Miller Fund of the Oregon Community Foundation are funding the center in part, said Pam Allister, Lovejoy development coordinator.

The center serves a particularly important function in the valley, said

1+ year volunteer Bonnie Greener because people often do not have the means or money to travel to Grants Pass. This way, they can still find out about Lovejoy without leaving their community.

"They want to stay here. People feel comfortable here," Greener said. "Plus it makes it (the experience) more intimate and accessible."

Cagle said she also hopes that once people hear about, or visit, the center more will want to volunteer.

"We need a lot more volunteers out here than we have," she said.

Shiery added he hopes to see more men volunteer as a result of the center opening.

Allister added that the center is strictly an information center, and not where people should go for medical emergencies.

The center also doesn't have a phone.

The group extended its appreciation to Immanuel Church for making a room available for the center. Lovejoy is renting the room from Immanuel.

burglaries "thinks they rule the town and hang out in Jubilee Park. And someone is buying them beer."

The Pernickas provided sign-up sheets for those wanting to help patrol or serve on a committee for making the group's concerns and requests known to officials. Among comments during the 45-minute meeting:

*We need to apply pressure to the city council and sheriff's office to protect our businesses.

*Because it's getting more difficult to stay in business in the city, including losses due to vandalism and burglaries, the city could become a ghost town as people get discouraged and leave.

*There are kids marauding through town in the dark hours, tearing down street signs, destroying planters and causing general havoc for businesses.

*Parents need to be responsible for their children.

*It seems that some of these bad kids are doing it because they are unsupervised and because they get a thrill out of stealing.

*We need to confront these kids and let them

know they're not welcome and that we will not stand for what they're doing.

*Centrally mounted video surveillance could help identify these people.

*The city curfew should be enforced, and groups of kids hanging around businesses or in the park, and wandering the streets should be contacted and questioned.

*Cave Junction seems

to be the ugly stepchild, not getting what we deserve and pay for.

*These kids are starting to run the town.

*We love this town and want to stay here, but need police protection.

*Hopefully, some 14-year-old isn't going to get smoked breaking into a business. And there is concern that merchants could be hurt also.
