Oregon Dept. of Transportation (ODOT) Public Transit Division will accept applications for three types of discretionary grants until 5 p.m. on Fri-

day, Oct. 31. Special Transportation Grants are available to providers of transportation services to the elderly and disabled persons.

Rural General Grants and Vehicle Preservation Grants are available to only to current recipients of state Special Transportation funds or Federal Transit Administration funds.

The division will award \$13.3 million in grants in these three program areas.

The time frame for grant programs is July 1 through June 30, 2005.
