## RCC founding president honored for his efforts

The Rogue Community College (RCC) Board of Education appointed Henry Pete, founding president of RCC, president emeritus, an honorary title granted in recognition of outstanding service.

The RCC board took the action at its meeting on Oct. 21.

Beginning in 1971 Pete guided RCC through its tenuous first years and left his mark on the college culture. Although he retired in 1980, Pete continues to help and serve the college, said President Rick Levine, adding that Pete clearly merits the emeritus honor.

"He remains a friend of the college through regular visits and interviews," Levine said.

A reception honoring the Pete is tentatively set for the Nov. 18 board meeting at the Medford campus.

Pete lives in Wilsonville and is working with current and past presidents to compile a history of coCommunity colleges in Oregon.

The board also accepted the following grants at the meeting:

\*USDA Rural Utilities

Services Distance learning and Telemedicine grant for \$237,137 to extend the college's interactive video capacity.

\*Perkins Regional vocational Education grant for \$13,000 from the Jackson Educational Service District for the Soutehr Oregon Women in Trades Fair.

\*U.S. Army Engineer District, Portland, grant for \$37,345 for water quality monitoring studies at Lost Creek and Applegate Reservoirs to be conducted by RCC science students.

\*Gordon Elwood Foundation award of \$20,000 to provide funds for low-income RCC students in short-term and workforce training employment certification programs.

\*Oregon manufacturing Extension partnership awards totaling \$1,970 for secondary wood products training systems projects.

The board also approved the 2003-06 classified bargaining agreement with the RCC Oregon School Employees Association.

The new three-year agreement includes a salary freeze for 2003-04.

## Students filling seats at RCC this fall despite tuition, fee increases

Parking lots are full and students are vying for classroom seats at Rogue Community College (RCC), where concerns that increasing tuition and higher fess would hurt enrollment have not materialized, according to President Rick Levine.

"Total enrollment is down slightly compared to a year ago, but the only reason is that we have had to cut back in our tutoring centers," Levine said.

RCC closed the Mar-

ket Street Learning Center in downtown Medford and the Learning Center in Grants Pass earlier this year to economize.

More than a month into the fall term, RCC officials report tuition projections on target at 29 percent (\$2,663,688) of the total tuition revenue projected for 2003-04.

"After tuition increases, we're relieved about that," said Lynda Warren, dean of College Services.
