Yuletide activities were among items discussed by Illinois Valley Chamber of Commerce directors during their meeting on Thursday, Nov. 20 in Wild River Brewing & Pizza Co. in Cave Junction.

An entry deadline of Dec. 20 was set for annual indoor and outdoor decoration contest for business members of the chamber. Entries will be judged by President Terri Smith of Northwest Hairlines and Director Martin San of Cave Junction Lions Club. Winners will receive the traveling trophy to display for the coming year. An entry form is in this issue.

Director Vicki Gill, of SOFCU, showed the four holiday gift baskets she prepared. Each contains a wide range of goodies, and are displayed in each of the valley's four banks --Klamath First, SOFCU, Home Valley and Evergreen Federal -- where raffle tickets are available.

Chamber directors and others will meet on Saturday, Nov. 29 to install holiday decorations on utility poles in Downtown Cave Junction and other locations in the valley. In addition, workers plan to replace the lights on the Community Christmas Tree on the lot between Junction Inn and Pizza Pit. Marty Hertler and Jim Valentine, who have cherry-picking equipment, likely will assist, it was indicated.

Vice President Ted Crocker, of Ted Crocker LTC, noted that the light strings are old and worn. The possibility of getting surplus strings from Grants Pass Chamber of Commerce was posed. Directors agreed that the city of Cave Junction should be approached next year during budget meetings to seek some funding.

Crocker reminded members that the annual Christmas Parade will be held in Downtown Cave Junction on Saturday, Dec. 6, with an alternate date of Dec. 13 if there is rain. The line-up will be at Evergreen Elementary School, and Crocker said

that help will be needed there to get the parade under way. Depending on North Pole conditions, the chamber will have Santa Claus in the procession. Lee Eschen, a good friend of Santa's, is checking on availability.

*The board welcomed new member, Clear Spaces Gallery, owned by Pam Cooper in Downtown Cave Junction.

*Heard from Dulcie Moore, chamber office manager, that the I.V. Visitor Center recorded 1,258 visitors during October, an increase of 180 from the same month a year ago.

*Gratefully accepted the donation of computer equipment for the chamber office from Bertha Miller of Wild River Brewing & Pizza Co.

Q: My aunt has Alzheimer's disease and I cannot care for her any longer. Can you suggest where I might put her? A: The answer depends on at what stage in the disease is your aunt. There are adult foster care homes and nursing homes that understand the special care needs for those with Alzheimer's disease. They can provide for safety of the person that wanders or is up during the night. These care needs are a 24hour responsibility for the staff to cover. You have experienced the impossibility for one person to handle this care alone. As her disease progresses, you will find that you can focus on helping the facility to preserve her dignity.

The day-to-day care needs many times drain the family member and deprive them of the opportunity to just be "family". When this happens, the role of advocate then goes to a stranger who doesn't know the little things that make real quality of life for the person.
