Dealing with children who abuse drugs topic of meeting

Drug and alcohol counselor Skip Saegar, who works as an outreach counselor for Choices, the Three Rivers School District and Josephine County Corrections, will hold a meeting at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 11 at the Illinois Valley Family Resources Center.

The meeting is open to the public and is for parents who have questions about how to deal with their children who are using drugs. The meeting is the result of a request by approximately 25 parents who are seeking help on the subject.

"I want to provide drug awareness, tell them what drugs are out there and let parents know how to talk to their children and what resources are available if they're children are using drugs," Saegar said.

"We work real hard to try and get community involvement," he added. "This is the first time members of the community have approached me to put something together. You'll be surprised about the kinds of drugs that are out there (in Illinois Valley.)"

Mike Rustom, a juvenile counselor, and Sara McDonald from the Commission for Children and Family's will also be on hand at the meeting to answer questions.
