Refunds in mail for overpriced CDs

Attorney General Hardy Myers last week announced that more than 40,000 checks have been mailed to Oregonians who filed claims as part of a multimillion dollar anti-trust settlement between state law enforcement and distributors and retailers of music compact discs (CDs).

It's anticipated that CD buyers in Oregon who registered a valid claim between December 2002 and March 2003 will receive checks for \$13.86.

"Oregon consumers paid higher prices for CDs because of corporate misconduct," Myers said. "It's time for Oregonians to be compensated for fraudulent activities which cost them financially."

The settlement stems from an August 2000 lawsuit in which 40 state attorneys general, including Oregon and three U.S. territories, alleged that the defendants conspired to illegally raise the prices of certain prerecorded music products by implementing Minimum Advertised Price (MAP) policies, in violation of state and federal laws.

The named defendants are music distributors Bertelsmann Music Group Inc., EMI Music Distribution, Warner-Elektra-Atlantic Corp., Sony Music Entertainment Inc., Universal Music Group and national retail chains Transworld Entertainment Corp., Tower Records and Musicland Stores Corp. In agreeing to settle the law-

suit, they denied all allegations of wrongdoing.

In addition to the cash payments, the settlement also requires that CDs will be distributed to organizations to further music-related programs or purposes reasonably targeted to benefit a substantial number of the purchasers of compact discs. An estimated 5.6 million CDs valued at \$77 million will be distributed in the com-

ing months with Oregon receiving approximately 60,000 CDs valued at more than \$700,000.
