Wonder about basic rule?

The speed at which you drive determines how much time you have to act or react and how long it takes to stop, said Oregon Driver and Motor Vehicle Services (DMV).

The higher your speed, the less time you have to spot hazards; judge the speed of other traffic; and react to avoid the mistakes that could affect safety.

The basic rule states that you must drive at a speed that is reasonable and prudent at all times. The basic rule applies on all streets and highways, even where maximum

speed limits are also set by law or posted.

To obey the basic rule, you need to think about your speed in relation to other traffic - including pedestrians and bicycles - the surface and width of the road, hazards at intersections, weather, visibility and any other conditions that could affect safety.

The planning commission is made up of nine residents from various geographic areas of Josephine County appointed by the Board of County Commissioners to serve four-year terms.

It is the job of the planning commission to review and decide significant land development requests, such as subdivisions, commercial, industrial and resource uses, and various conditional uses.

The commission may also hold public workshops and hearings to study specific development issues and work with planning staff, community organizations and other interested individuals to develop or revise land use regulations to address problems.
