On April 2, 1792, the Coinage Act established the U.S. Mint in Philadelphia ... April 3, 1860, the first Pony Express service began between Sacramento, Calif., and St. Joseph, Mo. ... March 30, 1867, Alaska was sold to the U.S. by Russia for \$7.2 million through the efforts of Secretary of State William H. Seward ... April 3, 1936, Bruno Hauptmann, convicted of kidnapping and killing Charles Lindbergh Jr., was executed ... March 31, 1943, "Oklahoma!" opened on Broadway ... April 2, 1947, the UN Security Council voted to place the Pacific islands formerly mandated to Japan under U.S. trusteeship ... March 29, 1951, Julius Rosenberg, his wife, Ethel, and Morton Sobell were found guilty of conspiracy to commit wartime espionage ... March 29, 1961, the 23rd Amendment was ratified, giving the District of Columbia citizens the right to vote in presidential elections ... April 4, 1968, Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., was assassinated in Memphis, Tenn.; James Earl Ray, an escaped convict, pleaded guilty to the slaying and was sentenced to 99 years in prison ... March 30, 1972, North Vietnamese forces launched the largest attacks in four years across the demilitarized zone ... March 29, 1973, the last U.S. troops left Vietnam ... April 1, 1973, North Vietnam released some 590 U.S. prisoners by this date ... March 31, 1976, in a "right to die" case, the New Jersey Supreme Court allowed comatose Karen Ann Quinlan to be removed from a respirator ... March 30, 1981, President Reagan was shot and seriously wounded in Washington, D.C., by John W. Hinckley, Jr., who also shot and seriously wounded a Secret Service agent, a policeman, and Press Secretary James Brady ... April 3, 1996, U.S. Commerce Secretary Ron Brown was killed in a plane crash in Croatia ... April 1, 2001, a U.S. Navy spy plane collided with a Chinese fighter plane over the South China Sea, killing the fighter pilot. (c) 2004 DBR Media, Inc.
