# Suspect sought in CJ fire station burglary

A former Illinois Vallev Fire District volunteer is wanted in connection with a burglary that occurred at Cave Junction Station 1, according to the Josephine County Sheriff's Office.

The suspect is identified as Apryl H. Tamayo, 28. of Grants Pass.

Detectives from the Josephine County Interagency Narcotics Team (JOINT), Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety, and sheriff's deputies served a search warrant on Monday, April 5 at Tamayo's residence in Grants Pass following an investigation involving the manufacture of methamphetamine.

During the search, de-

tectives identified property that was stolen three months earlier from the fire station on Caves Hwv. in Cave Junction.

Tamayo volunteered for several years at Station 1, as well as Station 3 in O'Brien, before quitting nearly four years ago.

"It hurts to know that a past member of our fire community violated our trust," said Chief Harry Rich.

Among the items recovered from the residence were medical equipment, a radio and charger, and protective brush attire.

During the search, detectives also seized some 134 marijuana plants, 35 of which were growing in the attic. It had been designed as an indoor marijuana grow room. Ninety-nine plants were growing in the master bedroom, said the sheriff's office.

Detectives also seized scales, methamphetamine, and approximately 3/4 ounce of an unknown crystalline substance.

Tamayo was not present during the search warrant service. JOINT detectives are seeking her in connection with the investigation and are asking the community for assistance.

Tamayo is known to drive a light-colored 1997 Toyota four-door vehicle with Oregon license WWD 956. She is a 5-10, white female adult, with blond hair and brown eyes.

## Jubilee Park restrooms to be improved

Sub-par restroom facilities at Jubilee Park are to be renovated to bring them into compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA).

The Cave Junction City Council has awarded a contract to Copeland Paving, Sand & Gravel Inc. for handicapped accessibility upgrades to three restrooms at the park, as well as adding an ADA ramp in the council chambers at city hall.

The council approved the award 4-0 during its regular meeting Monday night, April 12 in city hall.

Councilman Sandi Lund was not present.

Copeland's bid of \$43,777 was the only one received for the project. The bid was opened and read during a public meeting April 2 in city hall.

The city has grant money totaling \$84,000 earmarked for accessibility projects. According to Mayor Ed Faircloth, after the renovation, there might be enough money left to further enhance Jubilee Park by adding handicapped-accessible picnic tables with covers, and pave existing gravel paths.

Room for the proposed tables could be removing an existing storage shed.




