

Homicide 6th in JoCo since Sept.

The sixth homicide in the county since September 2003 was reported on Saturday, April 24 by Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO).

Reported dead of knife wounds is Arthur Maehl, 51.

Charged with murder is Stephen Allen Keough, 49. The men lived together, said JCSO, on Whispering Pines Lane about 5 miles southeast of Grants Pass.

JCSO said a call about a homicide was received on the 24th around 10 a.m. When deputies arrived, Maehl was pronounced dead, and Keough was taken into custody without incident.

Keough told detectives he and the victim had an argument the night before, and that it became physical. Keough said he stabbed Maehl several times with a knife, which was recovered at the scene by detectives.

The suspect told officers he planned to turn himself in on Monday, April 26.

charge the Lions Club for the park," said Jim Frick, a director of the I.V. Chamber of Commerce.

"I've never seen a function that brings in more revenue, more visitors...than the Lions Labor Day Festival," Frick said. He encouraged the council to reconsider the fee.

Most speakers received vigorous applause from the assembled crowd.

City Recorder Jim Polk said that funds are available through the state to cover the cost of the fee, should an organization choose to apply for them. Lyons responded that to pay the fee, or apply for money to cover the fees, would be tantamount to

admitting that the Lions in fact owed the fee. He did not want to set that precedent.

Due to the volume of testimony, Faircloth suggested all parties convene a workshop to consider the situation.

The workshop would likely be set for sometime in June, after the city's budget process is finished.

IVHS Achiever

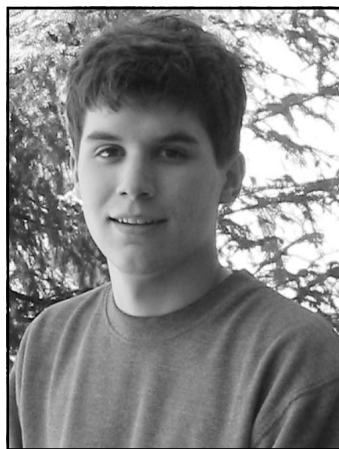
Adam Miller, a senior at Illinois Valley High School, is April Student of the Month, as chosen by the Josephine County Board of Commissioners.
