JOINT arrests GP resident on meth laboratory charges

Rural Grants Pass resident Darren L. Dailey, 42, was arrested on methamphetamine charges after a search warrant was served at 6582 Rogue River Hwy. by members of the Josephine Interagency Narcotics Team, said Sgt. Ken Selig of Josephine County Sheriff's Office.

Dailey, who was taken to county jail in the city of Grants Pass, was charged with manufacturing, possession and delivery of a controlled substance/methamphetamine; and possession of a precursor substance/meth.

Selig said that officers seized various toxic and hazardous chemicals used to manufacture meth. Investigators also found components and toxic waste from the meth lab, "discarded in the adjacent woods children are known to frequent."

Recent seizure of the lab led detectives to a storage unit on Redwood Avenue, said Selig. They found "more of the same chemicals used to manufacture meth." It is believed that the lab had produced several ounces of meth during three or four times of operation.

With Dailey was Lisa A. Hultquest-Powell, 42. Her possible involvement is being investigated with assistance from the county district attorney's office, Selig said.

Valleyites can attend Cycle Oregon info event


