

City issues 9 permits for projects large/small

Nine permits for various building changes or new construction were issued by the city of Cave Junction during April.

In addition, the city handled three pre-applications for planned subdivisions.

A 41-lot subdivision on Hanby Lane off N. Old Stage Road is planned by PJW Properties.

And Manor Communities Development is aiming for a 50-lot subdivision on Hanby Lane.

Over-the-counter permits issued included those for:

*A new manufactured home of 1,040 square feet, plus a garage comprising 576 square feet of space at 382 Hamilton Ave., issued to Douglas Gunning.

*A residence and garage totalling 1,898 square feet at 497 Laurel Road, issued to Hidden Valley Homes.

*A residence and garage of 1,952 square feet of space, also issued to Hidden Valley Homes, for 497 Laurel Road.

*An addition of 741 square feet of space at 135 N. Kerby Ave., issued to Hsiang Yao L. Vasquez.

Also, the city itself took out a permit for ADA modifications to restrooms at Jubilee Park.

Big crash in GP closes Parkway

Only one person was injured in a five-vehicle pile-up on the Grants Pass Parkway railroad overpass on Thursday, June 3.

The accident was reported around 10:45 a.m., said Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety (GPDPS).

Injured was GP resident Murrell Eldridge, 74, driver of a pickup truck which overturned. He was extricated using the 'Jaws of Life' and transported by American Medical Response (AMR) to Three Rivers Community Hospital.

Other drivers were Brookings resident Ed Kessler, 47, who was towing a trailer; Charles Wilton, 74, of Cave Junction; and GP resident Nick Blair, 75.

GPDPS provided the following account:

A rented trailer being pulled by a mid-sized pickup truck disconnected from the truck while approaching the overpass.

The trailer then struck an oncoming pickup truck which spun out of control before hitting a loaded log truck. The pickup then rolled over, trapping the driver. The trailer stopped after colliding with one more vehicle.

The log truck sustained damage to its fuel tank, spilling diesel on the overpass; which was quickly contained.

The Parkway was closed between F and M streets for 90 minutes.

Gas prices Wyden worry

U.S. Sen. Ron Wyden (D-Ore.) indicated that he will continue to block nomination of Deborah Majoras to head the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), after Majoras 'failed to offer concrete commitments at her confirmation hearing as to how she would lead the agency to fight high gasoline prices.'

Wyden said that he has long called on FTC to stop oil company mergers, refinery closures and anti-competitive gasoline marketing practices that have been proven to drive prices up for U.S. consumers, particularly in the Pacific Northwest.

He announced a 'hold' on Majoras' nomination in May when the nominee gave no indication that the FTC's years of inaction on high gasoline prices would end under her leadership.

Majoras also has been unable to answer whether her previous dealings with the oil companies Chevron and Texaco in the private sector would force her to recuse herself from oil pricing issues as FTC chairman, essentially leaving the commission without leadership as those issues are considered, Wyden said.

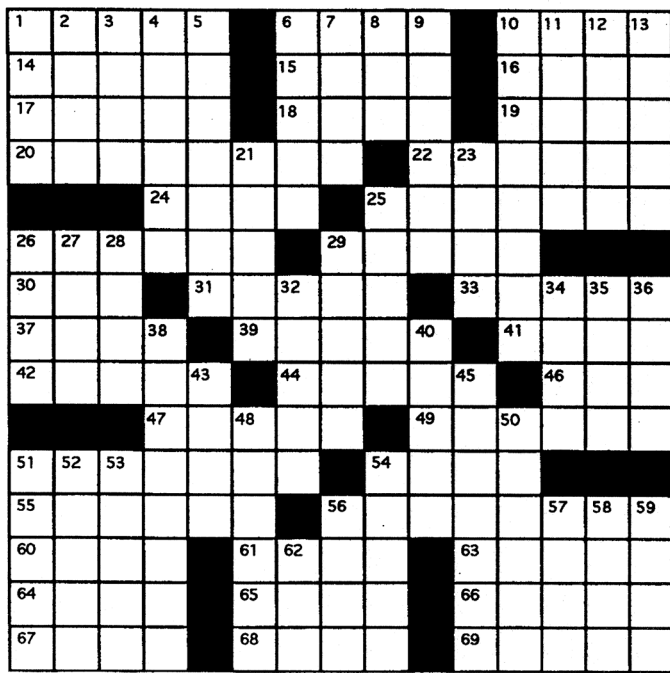
