Greenpeace gets booted

A citation was issued to Greenpeace for illegal occupancy of public lands by Medford District Bureau of Land Management (BLM) law enforcement on Sunday, June 27.

Greenpeace moved onto BLM land 5 miles west of Glendale during Memorial Day weekend. BLM issued a temporary letter of authorization to allow the group to stay on public land past the 14-day limit while its application was being considered.

On Tuesday, June 15,

BLM revoked the temporary letter of authorization and requested Greenpeace leave within 48 hours.

According to BLM, Greenpeace did not begin packing to leave the site until Sunday, June 27.

Greenpeace will be required to appear before a judge, who will assess the fines and costs incurred as a result of BLM responding to this activity.

Greenpeace must have an authorized special recreation permit before returning to the public land.

Rattlesnakes afoot in valley


People should be aware that warming weather has brought out some of the area's most dangerous critters - rattlesnakes.


