**NOTICE OF DECISION and FONSI**

The Environmental Assessment (EA) and Decision Record/Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for the Kamps road right-of-way application on the Medford District of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) have been completed. The decision is to grant the applicant a right-of-way for use of an existing BLM road and the construction of 300' of new road across BLM land in order to access private property for non-commercial use. The right-of-way is located south of Cave Junction in T40S, R8W, section 18, SWSE.

The EA and Decision Record/FONSI are available for review at the Medford District Office, 3040 Biddle Road, Medford, OR and on our web site ([www.or.blm.gov/Medford](http://www.or.blm.gov/Medford)) under planning documents/environmental assessments. For more information, contact Russell Groves at (541) 471-6944. While similar notices may be published in other newspapers, the date of publication in the Grants Pass Daily Courier will prevail as the effective date of this decision. Concurrent with this notice, a right-of-way grant is being offered to the applicant pursuant to subpart 2800 of Title 43 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

Any party adversely affected by this decision has the right to appeal to the Office of Hearings and Appeals Office of the Secretary, U. S. Department of the Interior, Board of Land Appeals (IBLA). Any appeal must be made in strict accordance with the regulations contained in 43 CFR part 4. This includes, among other requirements, the requirement that a notice of appeal must be filed in this office within 30 days of the effective date of this decision. The regulations also provide for petitioning for a stay of the decision, if desired. The decision to issue the right-of-way will be in full force and effect upon acceptance of the offered grant by the grantee and execution of the grant document by the BLM.
