The following positions will expire this year and will be filled by election, on a nonpartisan ballot, at the November 2, 2004, General Election.

NOTICE OF DECISION

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has completed a Record of Decision (ROD) regarding the implementation of the Biscuit Fire Recovery Project on BLM administered lands within the area of the Biscuit Fire. BLM's Medford District Manager, Timothy Reuwsaat, has selected Alternative 7, with some modification, for implementation on BLM administered lands. Alternative 7 is described in the Biscuit Fire Recovery Project Final Environmental Impact Statement (June 2004) (www.biscuitfire.com). The BLM was a cooperating agency in the preparation of this EIS.

The ROD provides for, in part, helicopter salvage of fire-killed trees within the matrix (38 acres) and late-successional reserve (157 acres) land allocations, fuel hazard reduction as needed on all salvage logged acres (195 acres), BLM's participation in landscape level fire recovery studies (Learning Opportunities), reforestation of salvage logged areas (195 acres), road maintenance (approx. 65 miles), culvert replacements to improve fish passage (4 sites), road stabilization (5.24 miles), prescribed burning (3,311 acres), and the construction of Fuel Management Zones (14 miles). Measures will be implemented as needed to reduce the potential for the spread of Port-Orford-Cedar root disease. There will be no treatments within the North Fork Silver Creek Research Natural Area (RNA).

This ROD is available on the BLM's website (www.or.blm.gov/Medford). Copies are available at the BLM's Medford District Office (3040 Biddle Road, Medford, OR) or at the BLM's Grants Pass Field Office in Grants Pass (200 NE Greenfield, Grants Pass). A copy of the ROD will be mailed upon request by calling Doug Henry at (541)-618-2276.

This decision is a BLM forest management decision. Administrative remedies are available to persons who believe that they will be adversely affected by this decision. Administrative recourse is available in accordance with BLM regulations and must follow the procedures and requirements described in 43 CFR 5003 - Administrative Remedies. In accordance with BLM Forest Management Regulations 43 CFR 5003.2(a&b), the effective date of this decision, as it relates to implementation through an advertised timber sale(s), is when the first Notice of Sale for such a sale appears in a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the lands affected by the decision are located. This newspaper is the Grants Pass Daily Courier. Publication of the first notice of sale establishes the effective date of the decision for those portions of this decision included in the timber sale / timber sale prospectus.

In accordance with BLM Forest Management Regulations 43 CFR 5003.2 (a&c), the effective date of this decision, as it pertains to implementing actions which are not part of an advertised timber sale, is the date of publication of this Notice of Decision in The Grants Pass Daily Courier. While similar notices may be published in other newspapers, the date of publication in the Grants Pass Daily Courier will prevail as the effective date of this decision. The effective date of this decision establishes the date initiating the protest period provided for by 43 CFR 5003.3. Any contest of this decision should state specifically which portion or element of the decision is being protested and cite the applicable regulations.

In order for a protest to be considered, it must be physically present in the BLM's Medford District Office (3040 Biddle Road, Medford, OR 97504) by the close of business (4:30 PM) on the 15th day following publication of this Notice of Decision in the Grants Pass Daily Courier. Only written, signed, hard copies of protests delivered by a mail service or hand and received either on or before the filing deadline will be considered. A postmark date will not qualify as meeting the deadline if the document is delivered after the 15 day protest period ends. Electronic mail and facsimile protest will not be considered valid protests.

BLM COMMENT PERIOD EXTENDED

The 30-day public comment period for the West Fork of the Illinois River Landscape Management Project environmental assessment (EA) has been extended an additional two weeks (45 days total).
