DMV notes basic speed rule

The Basic Rule states that you must drive at a speed that is reasonable and cautious for existing conditions, said Oregon Driver & Motor Vehicle Services (DMV).
To obey the basic rule, drivers need to think about their speed in relation to other traffic, including pedestrians and bicycles, plus the surface and width of the roadway.
Also, hazards at intersections, weather, visibility and any other conditions that could affect safety.
Those who drive at a speed that is unsafe for existing conditions in any area at any time, even if they are driving slower than the speed limit, are violating the basic rule, said DMV.
It noted that the basic rule does not allow drivers to exceed speed limits.

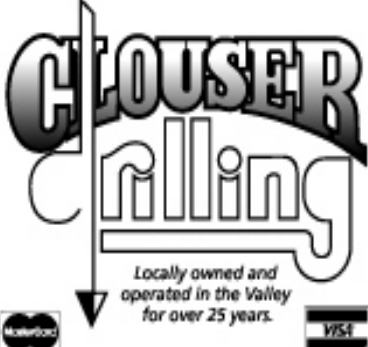
*Someone apparently drove off the road, damaging a fence, two trees and an irrigation valve on Laurel Road, but they didn’t leave their name.
