‘A tiskit, a tasket’ get your super basket of goodies at that new Cave Junction business: Basket Case

For gift-giving in many situations, with whimsical and useful items nearly overflowing their containers, a new business has opened in Cave Junction: Basket Case.

Besides creative offerings in baskets, the store carries merchandise including brightly colored Hawaiian shirts, muu-muus and sarongs. Plus Hawaiian hair and body mist.

Operated by Sandy Stellflug and her daughter, Tracy Nichols, the business at 204 N. Redwood Hwy. is next door to Bobbie’s World (run by Stellflug’s other daughter, Bobbie Loyd), and across from I.V. Video.

Basket Case is open Tuesdays through Saturdays from 10 to 4. The telephone number is 592-8547.

Although many baskets already are made up, Stellflug said that “custom orders” are welcome. The ready-to-go baskets include:

*The Couch Potato, with items including a crossword puzzle, a big box of Dots, a lap blanket, nuts, sunflower seeds and a movie.

*The Cha-Cha-Cha: This one has items that include margarita mix, corn chips, salsa, margarita salt, jalapeno peppers, a chip bowl and two margarita glasses.

*The PMS: Besides chocolate, Tylenol, Pamprin and Kleenex, this basket contains a Mr. Wonderful doll, who utters soothing, confident lines that include, “Let me make dinner,” “I’ll stop and ask for directions,” and “Oh, can’t your mother stay another week?”

Said Stellflug, a 14-year Illinois Valley resident, “We have baskets appropriate for a wide variety of occasions such as birthdays, baby showers (the Oh, Baby basket), anniversaries and just about any occasion for men, women and children.”

She also offers:

*The “Fido” basket with items including a Fris-

bee, bones and a toy. And there’s a Cool Cat basket with items suitable for the feline household members.

Stellflug said that the idea for the store came to her as a blessing. “I thought I couldn’t do anything like this,” she said, “but I’m finding out differently.”

Other basket offerings include the Swept Away with luxurious bath items; the Hot Tootsies for pedicures, and the I Caught the Big One, a basket for fishermen. The latter includes hooks, bait and a book, “A Man, A Can & A Plan.”

There’s also the Tea For Two with teas, mugs and other items. And the Cruisin’ basket with “car stuff” like polish.

Two more examples of her wares are the Boys Night Out and the Katy Kitchen baskets. The first holds items including poker chips, cards, a poker game, an insulated can holder and Pringles. The latter has utensils, a box of chocolate and dish towels, among other offerings.

Basket Case also carries some children’s books, and

some books on cooking and barbecuing.

Other merchandise includes salt scrubs for feet and hands, cologne from Hawaii, Hawaiian shorts for girls and boys, purses and some jewelry. And there are

sandals and flip-flops, T-shirts and “little girl” dresses.

“We’re ready to make up Christmas baskets or any type people want,” said Stellflug. “And we welcome browsers.”

OLCC lists alcohol cash

The city of Cave Junction received \$977 in September liquor revenue, while the city of Grants Pass received \$16,832.

Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) also reported that Josephine County received \$18,358.

Other area allocations, based on sales of distilled spirits:

Jackson County \$44,307; Ashland \$14,053; Butte Falls \$303; Central Point \$10,146; Eagle Point \$4,583; Gold Hill \$736; Jacksonville \$1,630; Medford \$46,889; Phoenix \$3,102; Rogue River \$1,307; Shady Cove \$1,747; and Talent \$3,924.

In addition, said OLCC, Roseburg received \$14,087; Eugene \$99,005; and Springfield \$37,687.

Statewide, OLCC distributed \$8.9 million.
