The semitruck, driven by Cave Junction resident Dale Speulda, 24, then collided with the Nissan Sentra driven by Landers. The northbound Suburban went into the lanes for southbound traffic, and in front of a pickup truck towing a trailer with lawn main-

tenance equipment. Soldrol, driver of the pickup, was admitted to Three Rivers Community Hospital (TRCH) in Grants Pass for treatment of injuries to her left hand. Tinsley was treated and released. Dangerfield also was taken to TRCH, where lifesaving efforts were tried.

Pipe bomb found near courts

A live pipe bomb found inside a small black bag near the Josephine County Courthouse in Downtown Grants Pass was detonated by an Oregon State Police Bomb Squad. The incident, added Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety (GPDPS), occurred early Saturday, Feb. 26. A GPDPS officer at 3:30 a.m. was told by a civilian that he had found a

bag in the area of Third and G streets, and that the contents appeared to be a bomb. GPDPS personnel from its police and fire divisions closed the area around the south side of the courthouse. Using a radio-controlled robot with video camera, OSP looked inside. The device was a live pipe bomb, it was determined, after it was detonated in a safe area.
