

Office park plan for CJ

*Because of Osborne’s plan to install utilities across 199 for his office/commercial development, SCHC likely will be able to begin construction without the city having to invoke a community block development grant that has been somewhat of a problem.

*Because of the forthcoming SCHC facility and the Cottage Business Park, with resultant traffic, Oregon Dept. of Transportation (ODOT) is leaning strongly toward adding a two-way left-turn lane on 199 from a point north of Laurel, south to Wild River Brewing & Pizza Co.

After the meeting, Chris Mallette, IVSHA executive director, said that a 1.5-acre parcel in Osborne’s park has been purchased for \$150,000.

“He gave us good terms, and we are grateful,” said Mallette, “not only because of being able to make the purchase, but because he has faith that our project will succeed.”

She noted that IVSHA has been looking for the right site for some time. Factors including zoning

and access to 199 were included.

Mallette said that groundbreaking is probably a year to 18 months away, while fund-raising for construction is conducted. The actual construction will take approximately six months, she estimated.

Regarding access to 199 from the Cottage Business Park, Osborne will build a 34-foot-wide collector street, Cottage Park Drive, as part of the project. Indications were that it would run between Laurel and 199, crossing Hanby Lane.

There are 16 conditions for the commercial park from the city and four from ODOT, all dealing with basically routine items in connection with subdivisions.

In a somewhat related matter, Cave Junction businessman Sally Palmer advised the council that she had spoken with the ODOT representatives at the meeting about traffic signals at 199 and River Street.

She told the council she was advised that the city should ask ODOT for another study of the intersection, especially with forthcoming developments.

cluding running, swimming, racquetball, volleyball and broom ball.

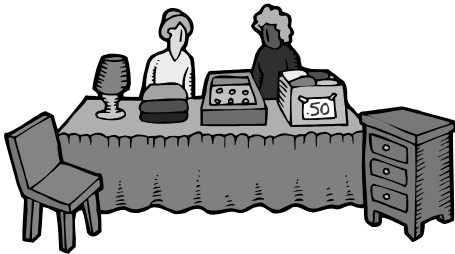

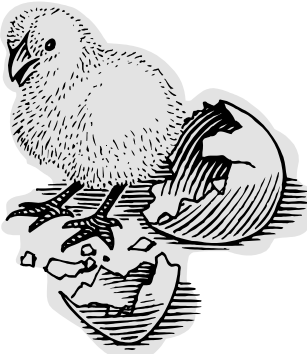
