

Hocker hopes to aid school system

Chelsea Hocker, a senior at Illinois Valley High School, serves on the Youth Advisory Team developed by state schools Superintendent Susan Castillo.

The Youth Advisory Team, a group of students from all over Oregon who meet four or five times a year to discuss issues related to education and give recommendations to the superintendent.

"I want to have the benefit of the advice of a diverse group of students," Castillo said. "This group plays an important role in changing and improving public education in Oregon by using their experiences as students to inform state leaders, educators, and com-

munity members.

"Students need a voice in the decisions that affect them," she said. "Decisions cannot be made about education without the input of students. This Youth Advisory Team has provided me the opportunity to get to know our youth through mature and intense discussions that continue to teach me as well as remind me why I am in this business." Castillo said.

Hocker, 17, is president of the IVHS National Honor Society Chapter, and was manager of the girls basketball team. She participates in the IVHS Swing Choir, and with the Mathletes. She also is doing an internship at Siskiyou Field Institute.

"The Youth Advisory Team seemed like a good opportunity to become involved and learn more about educational government processes that affect my peers and me," said Hocker.

"It seemed like a great opportunity to learn more and become more involved with education at a higher level," she said.

"One of the biggest problems with Oregon education," she added, "is the budget issues; there is not enough funding for everything we want to do.

"I would like to see the class sizes dramatically reduced, and I think that the health of students is an issue that would be great to have addressed," Hocker said.

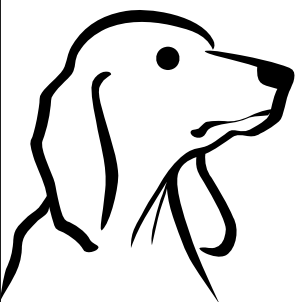
