CIM, CAM slam presented for potential change in '07

Because two current certificates of achievement for high school students are not providing the best education, say some legislators, a bill has been introduced to abolish them.

House Bill 3162 would end the Certificate of Initial Mastery (CIM) and Certificate of Advanced Mastery (CAM) as of 2007.

The bill, passed 34-23 by the House, also directs the Dept. of Education to contract with an independent educational assessment organization to develop and implement a statewide as-

essment system. System requirements are included in the bill.

"CIM and CAM are a drain on many of our teachers and students, as well as on our funding," said Rep. Linda Flores (R-Clackamas), carrier of the bill. "They have become cumbersome, time-consuming distractions for many teachers and kids.

"Because 70 percent of our students choose to not participate in CIM, it's time to move forward so that our kids can get the best education possible," she said.

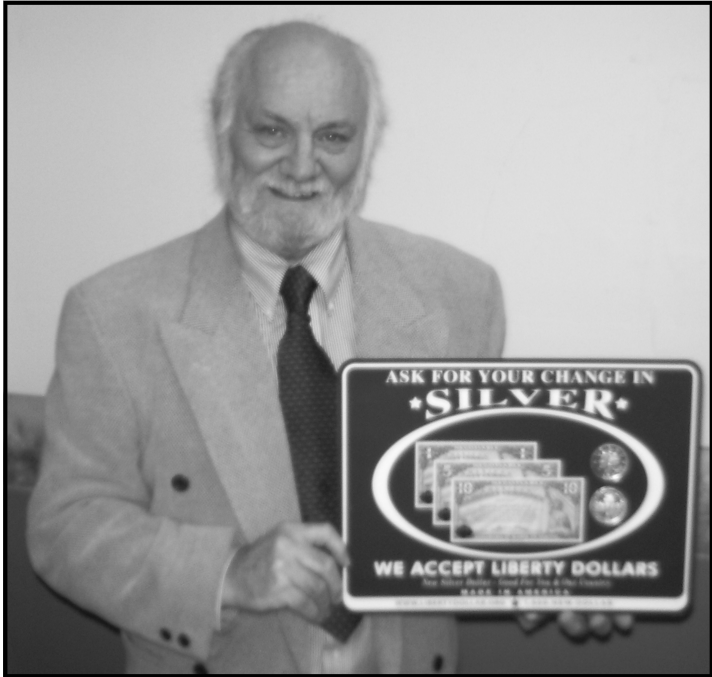

Liberty Dollar advantages noted as new currency

Cash, moolah, dough, lettuce, bread, dinero.

There are many names people use for money.

And now there's a new currency called The Liberty Dollar, represented in Illinois Valley and surrounding counties by Cave Junction resident Allen Heart.

His new business is Allen Aslan Heart Liberty Dollar of S.W. Oregon.

"The Liberty Dollar is an alternative money system," said Heart. "Some \$10 million is in circulation nationwide since Norfed, a nonprofit organization in Indiana, entered the free enterprise system in 1998.

"The Liberty Dollar," he said, "is real money, backed by gold and silver, unlike Federal Reserve Notes."

Liberty Dollars, from Sunshine Mint in Idaho, are made of 1 ounce of .999

pure silver and sold for \$10 face value. And because they're value-backed by gold and silver, said Heart, they actually are worth \$10 in trade for goods or services on a voluntary basis.

There also are silver denominations of \$1 and \$5 in negotiable silver certi-

icates. "They are 100 percent negotiable on a voluntary basis," he said.

One of the many advantages of The Liberty Dollar, said Heart, is that they can be redeemed on demand from the issuer.

To allay any doubts about the authenticity of the currency from a private enterprise, Heart notes that the Federal Reserve is not a government agency but a private organization. "It's no more a federal agency than Federal Express," he said.

He also notes that the U.S. Treasury has no problem with the dollars, and issued a statement calling them legitimate.

In I.V., participants who

accept or offer Liberty Dollars in change so far are Pietro's Italian Restaurant, Changes-Art & Energy, Good Neighbor Fencing, Many Phacits, and Debt Elimination by Heart. Liberty Dollars are available from Heart at 592-6652 or Golden Dragon Gate Chinese Restaurant.

Heart said that he taught for 26 years, mostly in junior high school, in suburban Minneapolis. Because his subject primarily was history, and because his parents lived through the Depression, he is familiar with how an economy can fail.

"This new currency is a definite back-up system," he said. "It's real, and could come in handy. We're trying to educate people about this, so that in case the fed-

eral system goes to pot, we could keep our economy running.

"We're setting up a monetary system of choice; it's on a free market, free enterprise system, which is how our country began."

Heart explains that "inflation" is a misnomer because what is really happening is that since 1913, the "dollar" has lost 96 percent of its purchasing power.

But silver has held its value and even increased during some years, he said.

Heart also has information about becoming a Liberty Associate.

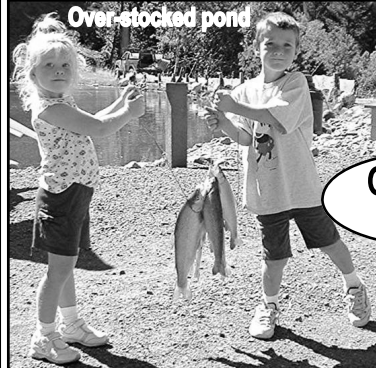
