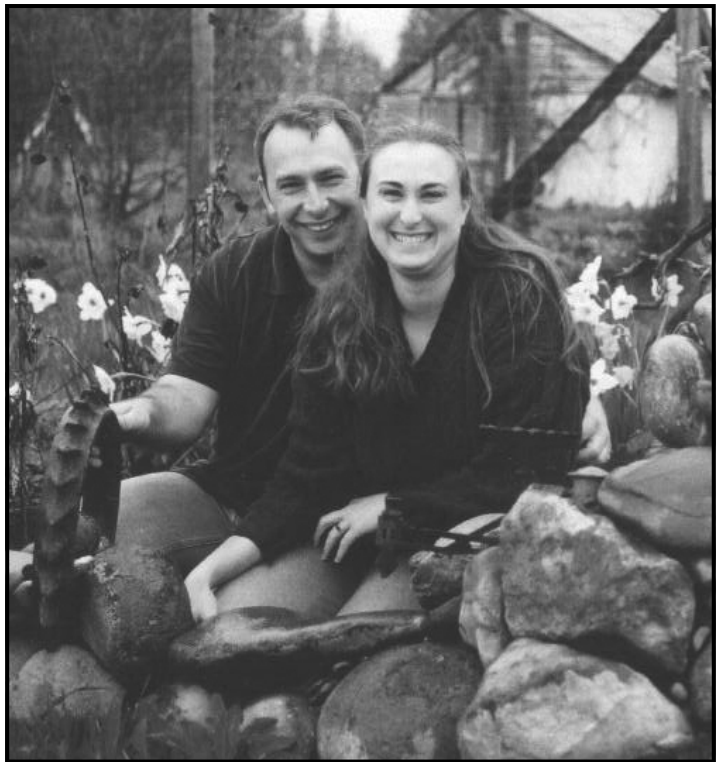




DANIEL THOMASON and DENISE ROGERS

Bills aid women’s care

House Speaker Karen Minnis (R-Wood Village) said that she applauds the Senate’s passage of House Bills 2495 and 2498, which protect access to certain women’s health-care screenings.

The bills reauthorize four critical health insurance requirements including breast cancer screening, mammograms, cervical cancer screening and Pap exams. These mandates were set to expire this year. The bills remove the sunset and make coverage permanent.

“We know that early detection saves lives,” said Minnis. “These are basic and important exams to which all women should have access. I know from painful personal experience -- having recently lost a friend to uterine cancer -- the importance of early detection and treatment.”

Mrs. Lookk was born July 7, 1931 in Wisconsin. She moved to Oregon in 1979 with her husband, Richard Lookk, and opened a gift shop, Middle Earth, in Kerby. He died in 1992, and she sold the shop.

In 2001 Mrs. Lookk had major heart surgery, and physicians told her that she had six months to a year to live. She lived another four years, during which she traveled, attended concerts and visited family throughout Oregon.

She enjoyed music, and had hundreds of records and cassettes. She obtained her first computer when she was 71. Along with her music, she became quite involved in her family genealogy, and through the Internet found family she didn’t know she had.

She was a member of the LDS Church, and Elaine Rigby spent many hours assisting her with her genealogy.

Mrs. Lookk is survived by two sons, Fredrick B. Lookk, of Southern California, and Randy B. Lookk, of Kerby; two daughters, Connie S. Wilson, of Cave Junction, and Heather A. Rothe, of Novato, Calif.; and six grandchildren.

She also leaves behind a daughter-in-law, Janice Lookk, of Kerby; and two sons-in-law, Lynn Wilson, Cave Junction, and Rick Rothe, Novato.

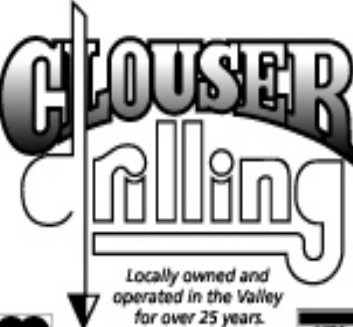
