Alvin B. Hueneryager

A family service will be held for former Illinois Valley resident Alvin Benjamin Hueneryager, 79, of Grants Pass, who died Thursday, May 19, 2005 at Providence Medford Medical Center.

Private interment will be at Granite Hill Cemetery in Grants Pass. Southern Oregon Cremation Services is in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Hueneryager was born on Aug. 26, 1925 in Waukegan, Ill. During World War II he served in the U.S. Coast Guard from 1943 to 1946 as a seaman, room steward, and deck steward. He returned home to Zion, Ill., and worked on a railroad as a wiper, messman, and oiler until 1948.

He moved to Portland, Ore. to be closer to his sister, and worked on a railroad along the Columbia River. He left there in the late-1950s, and worked for a well-known cabi-

netry company in Portland.

He married Glenna Audrey Baker in September 1961 in Stevenson, Wash. They moved in 1963 to Santa Clara, Calif., where he worked for a school district as a custodian.

In 1975 he moved to Cave Junction to be closer to his children. He worked as head custodian for Three Rivers School District until his retirement in 1987. He moved to Grants Pass in 2002 after his wife's death.

Mr. Hueneryager enjoyed camping in his younger years. Later he enjoyed woodwork-ing, traveling, reading about history, and watching historical shows on television.

Surviving are his stepson, Arlen C. Harper, of Kenne- wick, Wash.; a stepdaughter, Diana Sue Hardesty, of Grants Pass; nine grandchildren; and 16 great-grandchildren. Be- sides his wife, he was preceded in death by a sister, Enid.

I.V. Airport Advisory unit wonders about existence

When is an airport ad- visory board no longer a board?

That is a prime question in the minds of the Illinois Valley Airport Advisory Board's seven members, who met at the airport on Thursday evening, May 19.

"There's still the issue of if we are a viable entity, or just a group meeting," said Don McLennan, chair- man. "I'm sure eventually we'll hear something, but I have heard nothing at all from the commissioners or anyone."

McLennan was refer- ring to the March meeting, when Josephine County Commissioner Jim Raffenburg brought a proposal to disband the I.V. advisory group and the one for the Grants Pass Airport at Mer- lin. The plan, Raffenburg said, was to have a com- bined board.

The I.V. board last month adopted a resolution opposing a joint board. Their rationale includes no- tations that the airports have different problems and goals, and that a previous combined board was not successful.

It was noted that the Grants Pass advisory group has not met for the past two months, apparently because

its members are discouraged and awaiting resolution.

In other matters, the board briefly touched on eradication of star thistle in some runway cracks, poten- tial public activities, and progress on a planned busi- ness incubator at the airport.

"We're supposed to be an advisory board," said member Ed Russell. "But we have no topics, no direc- tion, no commissioner. I've been here (to monthly meet- ings) for three months, and I'm not a mushroom."

"We need to take the initiative for the airport," said member Lou Levison.

The meeting was ad- journed after 35 minutes.
