



COLLISION NEAR O'BRIEN - No injuries were reported in a three-vehicle crash on Hwy. 199 not far from the California border at 6:55 p.m. Friday, June 17, said Oregon State Police. Julia Rose, 23, was northbound and lost control on a curve. The front of her Suzuki struck the driver's side of a Pontiac driven by David Tyler, 39, and then collided head-on with a pickup truck driven by Juan Santos, 53. All drivers are from California. Rose was cited by OSP on a charge of driving too fast for conditions. In another crash handled by OSP, Kerby resident Amber Ziegler, 20 and her passenger, Kathlyn Stafford, 1, were reported uninjured Thursday, June 16 at 9:18 p.m. Her northbound Pathfinder went off 199 near Waldo Road and rolled. Thieving employees target of proposed bill

Courts could be allowed to impose a fine if a worker's position allowed them to commit a crime, said Rep. Gordon Anderson (R-Grants Pass).

House Bill 3471 would provide that latitude, he said. "Despite stealing from their employers," said Anderson, "workers still are eligible to receive their entire pensions from the em-

ployers they were stealing from.

"This bill would apply to any person convicted of a felony related to the per-

formance of a worker's employment, and the amount of the fine would be tied to the amount of the retirement benefits," Anderson said.

DEQ Water Quality Division gets new chief

Lauri Aunan has been appointed new administrator for the Dept. of Environmental Quality's (DEQ) Water Quality Division as of Monday, June 6.

Aunan joined DEQ in 1998 as its government relations manager and has represented the agency during four legislative sessions. Since 2003, she has managed DEQ's Office of Budget and Legislation, where she led teams responsible for development and implementation of the agency's budget, management of agency rule-making policies.

As administrator of the Water Quality Division, Aunan will be responsible

for leading water quality policy and program development and managing the water following recommendations from a statewide advisory panel representing business, governmental and environmental groups.

Program improvements include reducing the backlog of expired permits, moving to a watershed-based permit cycle, timely review of compliance data and improved compliance inspections.

"Clean water is essential for Oregon's economy and environment," said Aunan. "DEQ has a tremendous responsibility to protect and restore clean water, and we have an incredible

team of expert, dedicated staff. But it's not our responsibility alone.

"Success requires a partnership with Oregon communities, businesses and citizens. I look forward to working with all Oregonians toward achieving clean water goals," she said.

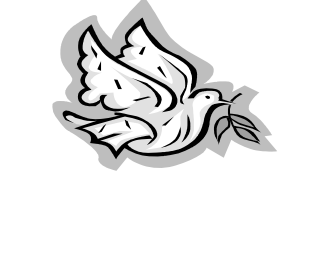
