OT for RNs subject of new bill

A change in overtime rules for registered nurses is in the offing because of House Bill 2800-A.

Rep. Gordon Anderson (R-Grants Pass) said that research by the Oregon Nurses Association on nurse staffing and shift length indicates that "risks of error" are increased when

shifts are longer than 12 hours.

The bill is a result of a collaborative effort, said Anderson, "from many in the industry to clarify procedures for nurses, and requires hospitals to establish staffing committees composed of nurse managers."

Under the bill, he said, hospitals

would retain the authority they need to mandate overtime during emergencies or disasters, or prevent nurses from voluntarily working overtime.

"This bill will protect Oregon patients from increased risk of errors that can accompany extended working hours," Anderson said.

Grayback Commercial Thin
Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest

As the responsible official I have decided to thin 60 acres of timber in the Grayback Watershed that was previously harvested and restocked with timber in the early 1960's. Both commercial and precommercial size trees will be cut. About 960 MBF of timber will be commercially harvested, using a ground based (tractor) harvesting system. No road construction is planned. The stand planned for harvest is predominantly Douglas fir, with small components of other coniferous species including: white fir, Port Orford Cedar, ponderosa pine, incense cedars, and others. Trees planned for harvest have a mean diameter of about 14", and vary between 8" and 30" diameter. After the commercial harvest, conifers less than 8" in diameter and other hardwoods will be thinned to further improve stand vigor and reduce fuels. Activity fuels will be treated. The project analysis is available for review at the Illinois Valley Ranger Station in Cave Junction, Oregon. Motorbikes 'dangerous'

Off-road motorbikes and dirt bikes are popular summer toys for children and teen-agers.

But many parents may not realize how dangerous they can be. Because they're ridden off-road, children don't need a license, safety training or helmets to ride these unregulated vehicles.

This has led to an increase in the number of motorbike injuries, according to a recent study published in the journal, "Pediatrics." An editorial in the same

issue, by Oregon Health & Sciences University Doernbecher Children's Hospital physicians Brahm Goldstein and James Lace, called for legislation requiring motorcycle helmets and safety education for children and their families before allowing them to ride motorbikes.

"They are more dangerous than bicycles because a child as young as 3 can ride a miniversion at high speeds without a helmet," Goldstein said.
