

## GP resident arrested for assault of two people

After two people reported that they were assaulted, Grants Pass resident Lawrence Allen Brown, 39, was arrested on several charges Saturday, June 25, said Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety (GPDPS).

Brown was charged with two counts of fourth-degree assault, and one count each of first-degree burglary, third-degree robbery, driving under the influence of an intoxicant, and unlawful entry to a motor vehicle, said GPDPS.

The agency reported that at approximately 5 p.m. Brown went to the residence of his sister, Patsy Lou Ogden, 35 on Foundry Street. He became upset when she refused to go downtown to buy him something. He struck her face; then grabbed her purse. She was able to keep it, and Brown punched her two more times in the head and ribs, said GPDPS.

A neighbor, Anthony Brenton, 46, came to assist, and was assaulted by Brown, said GPDPS. Brown then pursued him into a garage, continuing the assault.

Josephine County Sheriff's Office helped locate and detain the suspect with GPDPS officers.

## ODOT's \$16 million work

will continue to bear traffic as ODOT workers build a new, permanent bridge adjacent to the existing structure.

"There might be times when people have to stop because workers are moving a big piece of equipment on or off the highway," said Leaning, "but it'd be very minimal. The whole purpose is to keep traffic flowing."

The next two bridges to be renovated are those crossing the Big West Fork and the East Fork of Illinois River. Construction on them will begin in June 2006 and continue through May 2007.

Funding for the bridge projects is provided by the Oregon Transportation Investment Act (OTIA), which raised vehicle registration fees in 2003. This funding boost, passed by the Oregon Legislature, is the first major source of funding for highways and bridges in 50 years, ODOT said.

OTIA dollars, with a "mish-mash" of other state dollars, also will fund the

major Laurel Road Project, which will begin in 2007.

"The Laurel Road Project will add turning lanes to the golf course and to Laurel Road, and the bridge over George Creek will be replaced and widened," Leaning explained.

Another project on the drawing board is the Grants Pass Expressway Project. Two committees, the Citizen Advisory Committee and the Project Development Team, are meeting monthly to pin-point problem areas of Hwy. 199 between Tussey Lane and Midway Avenue.

Solutions are being sought to address the safety issues and congestion problems in this area.

Planning is expected to wrap up sometime early next year with construction to follow sometime afterward.
