slow or no response to non-emergency calls such as those to report burglaries or vandalism. Daniel said that there has to be a priority system and that crimes of violence against people take precedence.

Andrea Thomas, of Nacho Mama's, told the council Monday that she phoned to report an attempted break-in recently. She was told, she said, that it would be at least 90 minutes before a deputy would respond because of a shift change at 11 p.m.

She left her cafe, and asked to be notified when an officer would arrive. During the interim, she said, a door was kicked in, and her business burglarized.

She said she had to close for three days, and told the council that she believes the 40-hour per week city patrol

"is totally inadequate."

Thomas also commented that four people, whom she said were responsible for an earlier crime spree, apparently have been released from prison and are back in Cave Junction.

She said that business owners should have been notified. Thomas also said that she has the names of three persons possibly linked to the burglary at the city swimming pool July 10, and that she gave the names to a deputy.

In other business the council voted 5-0 to declare a nuisance and proceed with legal action against Robbie and Joan Robinson in connection with someone living in a travel trailer at their business.

The couple have refused to comply with a city ordinance prohibiting someone living on a commercial site. The Robinsons said that the person is a night watchman who has prevented vandalism and burglary.

Others say that the person lives there, and that a large number of undesirable people are congregating at the site.

Chief Harry Rich, of I.V. Fire District, was at Monday's meeting, and told the council that a citation could be issued at the location if there is one more incident of an open burn near the watchman's location.

Material in a 55-gallon drum apparently has been ignited some evenings.

which will tell you if you have any of the top 20 bacteria in your water."

Another speaker was Bruce Son, interim water-master of the area and an employee of the Oregon Water Resource Dept. for the past 28 years.

Son educated the attendees on water law.

"All water rights are first in time, first in rights," he said.

"Whoever started using the water first has the right to use the water, so if a junior water user is using water and that interferes with the senior's use, then we'll have to shut off the junior's water, so that the senior's water is restored," Son explained.

Gordon Lyford, from I.V. Soil & Water Conservation District, added that the law gives value to the water and certainty to its users.

However, the quality of the water available is never certain, especially in the Selma area, Lyford said.

OSU, salmon beneficiaries of U.S. largesse

U.S. Sen. Ron Wyden (D-Ore.) announced that the Senate Appropriations Committee has approved funding for the Pacific Coast Salmon Recovery Fund and for Oregon State University (OSU) for oceanic observation research.

The funding approved was included in the Senate's FY 2006 Commerce/Justice/Science (CJS) funding bill. The legislation next will be considered by the full Senate, and then a House-Senate conference committee, which will direct additional funds to specific programs across the nation.

"The funding approved for oceanic research is particularly important and timely in light of the recent tsunami warnings along the West Coast," said Wyden.

The Senate FY 2006 CJS Appropriations bill includes funding for the following programs:

*The Pacific Coast Salmon Recovery Fund will receive \$13 million for Oregon to fund habitat restoration, and data collection.

*Oregon State University at Corvallis will receive \$2 million for development of the Oregon Coastal Ocean Observing System. It will consist of instrumentation deployed in the ocean to return real-time data to help improve the safety and efficiency of U.S. marine operations and to mitigate effects of natural disasters including tsunamis.

Funding of \$118.9 million also was approved for 13 regional initiatives that will benefit Oregon, the senator said
