Former Cave Junction resident Glen Russell Davis, 80, of Grants Pass, died Nov. 29, 2005 at Three Rivers Community Hospital, Grants Pass. Viewing was at Chapel of the Valley-L.B. Hall Funeral Home Saturday, Dec. 3. A funeral service followed at the funeral home with the Rev. Ken Bern officiating. Burial was at Hawthorne Memorial Gardens, Grants Pass. Mr. Davis was born on Jan. 17, 1925 in Olivet, S.D.. He joined the U.S. Army and served with the 1398th Engineer Construc-

tion Battalion during World War II. He was awarded the Asiatic Pacific Service Medal and the WWII Victory Medal. On May 8, 1948 in San Francisco, he married the former Flourance Looper, who survives. They lived in Cave Junction until 1959, when they moved to Grants Pass. He was self-employed in the construction industry; and worked throughout the Pacific Northwest until retirement in 1988. His hobbies included fishing, hunting and working in his yard. Besides his wife, he is survived by a son, Russell Davis, of Roseburg; two daughters, Sally Sergeant, of Stayton, and Nancy Harper, of Grants Pass; three sisters, Priscilla Mellow and Penny Girona, both of Redding, Calif., and Millicent Looper, of Port Orford; 10 grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.

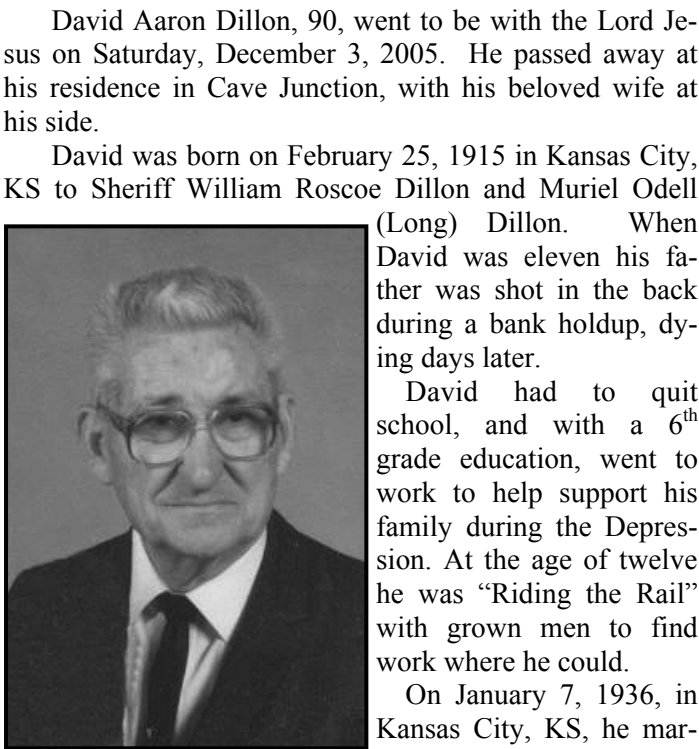
Richard S. Watkins

David Dillon



David Aaron Dillon, 90, went to be with the Lord Jesus on Saturday, December 3, 2005. He passed away at his residence in Cave Junction, with his beloved wife at his side. David was born on February 25, 1915 in Kansas City, KS to Sheriff William Roscoe Dillon and Muriel Odell (Long) Dillon. When David was eleven his father was shot in the back during a bank holdup, dying days later. David had to quit school, and with a 6th grade education, went to work to help support his family during the Depression. At the age of twelve he was "Riding the Rail" with grown men to find work where he could. On January 7, 1936, in Kansas City, KS, he married the love of his life, Rosamary Brunk. They lived in Kansas for a while, and then moved to Southern California. David began working for Northrup Aircraft in 1940; he started as a pattern-maker, and attended night classes through Northrup to further his education. He later worked as Professor of Aeronautical Engineering for Northrop Institute of Technology, which bestowed an honorary Doctorate degree on him. While at Northrop, he helped design and build the "Flying Wing," forerunner of the modern Stealth Bomber, and he built the first Concrete Wind Tunnel. He and his wife also started Centinela Valley Book and Bible House in Hawthorne, CA. In 1967, David moved his family to Cave Junction, OR, while he continued working for Northrup. He joined his family in Oregon in 1973, and worked for Bi-Mart in Grants Pass, OR, in the Hardware Department, for five years in the mid-70s. The greatest joy of David's life was teaching and talking about Jesus and leading people to the saving grace that comes from Jesus Christ. David is survived by and will be greatly missed by his wife of nearly 70 years, Rosamary Dillon; his children, Mary Belle Munnings, Carol Ann Slife, Dolores "Dee Dee" Jean Higgins, Mark Aaron Dillon, Ruth Ellen Jorgensen, Martha Christine Kapocias, Deborah L. Dillon-Wood, Stephen Roscoe Dillon, and Jonathan "Paul" Dillon; 16 grandchildren; 20 great-grandchildren; and one sister, Ruth Crozier. His son, Joel David Dillon, preceded him in death in June of 2002. A memorial service will be held at Community Bible Church in Cave Junction on Friday, December 9, 2005, at 11:00 a.m. David was buried next to his son, Joel, at Paul Dillon's family plot on Tuesday, December 6th.
