NPS Cave jobs said available

Oregon Caves National Monument will participate in the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) program this year, said Superintendent Craig Ackerman, of the National Park Service (NPS).

YCC is a summer employment program for young men and women, ages 15 through 18, who work and learn together by participating in conservation work on public land. The six-week program will begin on June 26, and conclude on Aug. 4. At least three participants will be selected during a drawing of applicant names on June 12.

Work schedules will begin 8 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. each day, Mondays through Fridays, except on federal holidays.
