Donald Dean Haviland

Donald Dean Haviland, 76, of Cave Junction, a former member of the Illinois Valley Fire District Board of Directors, died Tuesday, June 20, 2006 at Three Rivers Community Hospital in Grants Pass

A graveside service was held Friday, June 23 at Eagle Point National Cemetery.

Officiating was Chaplain Tom McGowen, of Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety. The eulogy was by Illinois Valley Fire Chief Harry Rich.

Mr. Haviland was born, Feb. 8, 1930 in Sioux City, Iowa. He was a U.S. Navy veteran. He moved to Illinois Valley in 1989 from Cerritos, Calif.

He served two full terms as an elected director of the Illinois Valley Fire District board, including service as president.

He is survived by his wife, Vera Haviland, of Cave Junction; four daughters, Linda Robillard, of Darby, Mont., Suzanne Bishop, of Simi Val-

ley, Calif., Diane Courtney, of Whittier, Calif., and Donna Haviland, of Grants Pass; a son, James Haviland, of Bermuda Dunes, Calif.; a brother, Gene Haviland, of Rapid City, S.D.; two sisters, Carolyn Wunderlich, of Cave Junction, and Florence White, of Valencia, Calif.; 20 grandchildren; and 27 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Squire and Adele Haviland; and two brothers, Lyle Haviland and Scott Haviland.

Arrangements were made through Illinois Valley Funeral Home.

Elizabeth Jane ‘Liz’ Prendergast

Former Illinois Valley resident Elizabeth Jane “Liz” Prendergast, 60, of Harbor, died June 8, 2006 at a hospital of natural causes.

She was born March 15, 1946, in London, England.

She married Richard “Nick” Eugene Prendergast in 1972 in Santa Barbara, Calif.

After becoming paralyzed in 1988, she became a voice for others with disabilities. Not only did she adjust to being in a wheelchair, but she took on being an advocate for the physically challenged.

After moving to Brookings from Cave Junction approximately seven years ago, Mrs. Prendergast started South Coast Independent Living Services (SCILS) at the Hanscam Center in October 2001. SCILS is a grass-roots organization run by people with disabilities, advocating for others with disabilities.

She is survived by her husband, “Nick” Prendergast, of Harbor; a son, Ezra Thomas Plumb, of Morro Bay, Calif.; a daughter Kai Koski, of Oregon City; her mother, Joan Campbell, of White Rock, British Columbia; two sisters, Susan Campbell, of White Rock, and Annie Falconer, of Wilsonville; and eight grandchildren.

Illinois River Ranch mining work on hold

JoCo orders cease-and-desist; DOGAMI issues notice of violation and suspension

Holland Loop neighbors of Barlow Sand & Gravel are expressing relief -- for now -- upon hearing that mining activities at Illinois River Ranch have been put on hold.

In an email dated June 26 from Josephine County Planning Director Michael Snider to Bill Peterson, Barlow’s finance and administrative representative, the company was notified that it must “immediately cease and desist from all mining preparation, mining, and reclamation work” at the site in the 2000 block of Holland Loop.

As a result of this finding, Oregon Dept. of Geology and Mineral Industries (DOGAMI), has issued a Notice of Violation and Suspension Order.

According to Snider, historic mining activity on

the property in question is “pursuant to a conditional-use permit issued in 1979.” This distinction subjects the activity to Section 91.020.B of the Josephine County Rural Land Development Code (RLDC), requiring a county permit (a site plan review or conditional use approval) before aggregate mining can be reauthorized if the site has been inactive for 12 or more years.

Barlow’s plan to mine the site hinged upon the presumption that the activity was a legal, non-conforming use, consistent with Barlow Rock’s min-

ing activity in the area dating from the 1960s. Subsequent review of the records for the property found this not to be so, Snider said.

Barlow is challenged to provide documentation demonstrating that the mining operator on site “was issued and continuously renewed a state mining permit” within the 12-year time-frame outlined in the RLDC.

Snider reiterated the county’s openness to considering additional information, but “further mining will require either an approved site plan or conditional-use permit.”
