Salvage logging protest forces Eight Dollar closure

public safety hazard, and the agency responded by closing the access roads to protect the health and safety of people near the area.

"The road closure is the access and log haul route of the Mike's Gulch Salvage Sale. It is now prohibited to operate motorized vehicles on the following roads within the boundaries or jurisdiction of the Illinois Valley Ranger District, Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest, Josephine County, Oregon.

Gov. Kulongoski chastised

Gov. Kulongoski, pushing to protect inventoried roadless areas, has been taken to task by the American Forest Resource Council (AFRC).

It represents approximately 90 wood product manufacturers and forest land owners in 12 Western states.

Said AFRC, "The governor's roadless view ignores the fact that catastrophic wildfires do not recognize roadless area boundaries, just as they don't recognize wilderness boundaries, private property boundaries or critical habitat designations."

There are approximately 2 million acres of inventoried roadless areas in the state's national forests. The figure includes around 368,000 acres in the Rogue

"The public closure affects the Eight Dollar Road and several spurs, including Forest Roads 4201.000, 4201.090, 4201.844 and 4201.845 near the forest boundary in the I.V. Ranger District, Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest.

"This road system leads to the Babyfoot Lake Trailhead."

The agency continued that, "The forest service issues closure orders when activities or behavior become unsafe, violent, dis-

Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest.

Kulongoski and the governors of California, Washington and New Mexico have sued the federal government to reinstate the 2001 roadless rule. Their suit contends that the Bush administration has violated the National Environmental Protection Act by failing to provide an adequate public process for the changes in the rules.

Noted AFRC, "Congressional and newspaper investigations have uncovered a well-financed (more than \$10 million) public relations and signature gathering campaign in support of the roadless area rule, which was highly coordinated with key individuals in the Clinton administration."

ruptive, or destructive. The agency has the responsibility to address unlawful activities in the short term and can prohibit public access to specific areas to maintain safety and the rights of others.

"The forest service," it continued, "has a contractual obligation to provide access for the purchaser, Silver Creek Timber Co., to operate this timber sale.

"The Mike's Gulch Sale meets all environmental laws. The sale supports the economy in surrounding

communities by creating family wage jobs and generating dollars to the local economies.

"The national forest land in Mike's Gulch Fire Salvage timber harvest areas will continue to be roadless.

"No roads will be constructed as part of this timber sale. All salvage yarding will be completed by helicopter," concluded USFS.

The sale involves nearly 9 million board feet of timber from the 2002 Biscuit Fire.
