



Healthy children, renewable energy parts of governor's plan for Oregon during '07

“Oregon is entering a great era of opportunity after coming through the recession,” Kulongoski said. “This session positions us to not only serve the basic needs of our citizens, but to ensure that we’re making the right investments and policy choices to do better and move Oregon forward.”

The governor's Energy Independence Plan "provides incentives for businesses and individuals to purchase alternative energy and adopt energy-efficient practices; opens the door to greater alternative energy and fuel research and production; and establishes reasonable mandates to provide certainty that Oregon ends its dependence on foreign oil and grows a domestic energy economy."

The governor's Education Enterprise will provide long-term stable, adequate and predictable funding for public schools, provide full funding for Oregon Head Start and make post secondary education affordable for lower and middle-income Oregonians."

“My agenda is ambitious, but we shouldn’t strive for anything less than improving our schools, expanding access to health care, promoting alternative energy, and continuing to grow Oregon’s economy,” the governor said. “That is why the public elected us, and I am optimistic that the Legislature is just as committed to using this session to accomplish the public’s priorities.”

The report summarizes the work of the task force last year and recommends two major changes to state policy: State law should prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation and should provide a framework for legal recognition of same-sex relationships in a form that is different than marriage.”

“Equal protection under the law is the cornerstone of a just and democratic society,” said Kulongoski. “My commitment to ending discrimination based on sexual orientation dates back more than 30 years to when I first introduced such legislation in 1975.”
