A Look Back This Week

On Feb. 4, 1899, Filipino insurgents, unable to gain recognition of independence from the United States, started a guerilla war ... Jan. 31, 1917, suffering from a British blockade, Germany declared almost unconditional submarine warfare ... Feb. 3, 1917, the United States cut diplomatic ties with Germany ... Jan. 31, 1950, President Truman authorized production of the hydrogen bomb ... Jan. 31, 1958, the first U.S. Earth satellite to go into orbit, the Explorer I, was launched by the U.S. Army from Cape Canaveral, Fla.; it discovered the Van Allen radiation belt ... Feb. 1, 1960, protest sit-ins began when four Black college students in Greensboro, N.C., refused to move from a Woolworth's lunch counter when denied service ... Jan. 30, 1968, Communist troops launched the "Tet Offensive," attacking Saigon and 30 province capitals, which suffered heavy casualties ... Feb. 3,

1984, the space shuttle "Challenger" was launched on its fourth trip into space ... Jan. 31, 1995, President Clinton invoked emergency powers to extend a \$20 billion loan to help Mexico avoid financial collapse ... 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LBMS students recognized for attitudes

Earlier this school year, Lorna Byrne Middle School started the Gold Card Club for students.
Being awarded a gold card acknowledges those students who are respectful, responsible and safe at school.
In the first round of applications, staff looked at students who had no major office referrals, less than three detention referrals, less than three times tardy, 92 percent atten-

dance and no fines or fees owing to the library since the beginning of the year.
Additionally, teacher teams looked at students who were making an effort in their classrooms academically. This did not mean that they had to have a certain grade, but that they were making an obvious attempt to do the best they can.
Students who are rejected for one reason or another will be given an opportunity to re-apply every three weeks. If they show that they have changed the condition that caused them to be rejected, they will be awarded a gold card.
Students who have a gold card must continue to maintain the basic standards or they will have it taken away and have to reapply at the next application date.
Much is planned for Gold Card members. There are daily and weekly surprise gold card events that encourage students to keep their gold cards in their possession at all times. These can be early lunches, extra credit points, free time in the gym or "whatever we can think of to reward students who are choosing to be responsible, respectful and safe."
Other larger events include dances, assemblies, or games that will be scheduled so that students can prepare to attend. For instance, for Thanksgiving turkey bingo games were held, and each grade level had the chance to win turkeys for their family for Thanksgiving.
A major event for Gold Card students will be a ski trip to Mt. Ashland in February. Students will have equipment, lessons and a lift pass for a day of fun in the snow.
"Encourage and support your child to become a Gold Card member," said LBMS. "This makes the climate of our school positive and conducive to learning. We want every child to feel save and welcome at our school."
"This Gold Card activity is one way to recognize the students who are making positive choices every day."
