Task force to review SAR procedures

Oregon has a new executive order to establish a task force to review whether to amend numerous state policies to ensure proper coordination, communication and effective pooling of resources between federal, state and local authorities in search-and-rescue (SAR) operations.

The order was issued by Gov. Kulongoski.

"Now that we have all the facts from the state and local levels, we need to come together to review this information, our approach to search and rescue, and identify ways we can strengthen our communications and coordination in the future," said Kulongoski.

"I appreciate the extensive time and efforts of professionals and volunteers during recent searches," he said, "and my goal for the task force is to examine Oregon's

SAR laws to ensure that they adequately support the safety of our citizens and our visitors."

Establishing the task force follows the Jan. 5 completion of the Oregon Office of Emergency Management chronology outlining the facts surrounding the efforts undertaken by state agencies involved in the search for the Kim Family, of San Francisco, near Grants Pass last month.

The task force will also be assisted by the information and recommendations in a report by the Oregon State Sheriff's Association (OSAA) issued last week. The panel will submit its recommendations to the governor no later than March 31.

"I appreciate the hard work by the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and OSAA to provide a full account of the search for the Kim Family," said

the governor. "It is important that we move forward in this process based on informed discussion and constructive consideration.

"Oregon remains a state of diverse environments and large unpopulated areas. I look forward to this task force's recommendations on how we can further improve search and rescue efforts."

The task force will be led by Joe O'Leary, the governor's senior policy adviser for public safety. It will be comprised of 13 to 15 members including representatives from OSAA, OEM, the Oregon State Police, the Oregon Military Dept., the Portland Police Bureau, the Civil Air Patrol, the Bureau of Land Management, and the U.S. Forest Service.

It also will include a member of the Oregon House of Representatives, the Oregon Senate, a certified SAR volunteer, a representative from the cellular phone industry and a member of the general public.

A Look Back ...

On Feb. 10, 1763, a peace pact was signed between France and Britain, ending the French and Indian War; France lost Canada and the Midwest ... Feb. 6, 1778, France signed a treaty of aid with the United States to help the Americans with their war of independence from Great Britain ... Feb. 9, 1825, after a deadlocked election, John Quincy Adams was elected president by the House of Representatives ... Feb. 8, 1861, seven southern states set up the Confederate States of America with Jefferson Davis as president and captured federal arsenals and forts ... Feb. 11, 1945, the Yalta Conference ended with President Franklin Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, and Soviet leader Josef Stalin agreeing that their three countries, plus France, would occupy Germany and that the Soviet Union would enter the war against Japan ... Feb. 7, 1984, U.S. Navy Capt. Bruce McCandless, followed by U.S. Army Lt. Col. Robert Stewart, became the first humans to fly free of a spacecraft ... Feb. 7, 2000, President Clinton submitted his last federal budget, projecting a surplus of \$184 billion, the third consecutive surplus and the highest ever ... Feb. 9, 2001, nine people on a Japanese fishing boat were killed when it collided with a U.S. Navy submarine nine miles from Pearl Harbor in Hawaii ... Feb. 5, 2005, while in Ankara, Turkey, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice said that Russia's punishment of political dissenters was complicating relations with the United States ... Feb. 7, 2005, President Bush sent Congress a \$2.57 trillion federal budget for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1, 2005; the budget would slow the growth of government spending from 8.2 percent to 3.6 percent in one year and put the country on the road to cutting the federal budget deficit in half by 2009 ... Feb. 9, 2005, North Korea confirmed what had been widely suspected, that it had nuclear weapons.
