Having lived a life of kindness, dignity and grace, Pat passed on free of conflict or worries; providing those around her with lessons on how to live well.

Pat was born on Sept. 23, 1925 in Seattle. Her family then moved to San Francisco, where she was raised. A tom-boy as a child, Pat became the only girl on a high school heavy-rescue team during World War II. She was editor of her high school newspaper and led horseback trail rides in the Sierra Mountains.

As a young woman, Pat was a switchboard operator, but then feeling more adventurous, she became a Pan Am airline stewardess in the late 40’s. She spent time in Shang Hai during the revolution after WWII. Pat married Russell Lloyd Rasch in 1952, and they raised four daughters in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The family enjoyed their animals, camping and boating. Russell Rasch died in 1987.

Professionally, Pat was a free-lance writer and an office manager. Active in local politics, she ran for Wisconsin State Assembly in 1970. In her later years Pat married Archie Simonsen, who passed on in 1996. After which, Pat moved to Cave Junction in 1997 with her daughter, Annette, a dog trainer and environmental activist. She was a board member with the Community Response Team until her health forced

her resignation in in 2001.

Pat fervently believed that everyone should participate in politics to keep government honest and effective.

Pat is survived by a brother, Bob McGee, of Placer-ville, Calif.; and her four daughters and three sons-in-law, Catherine and Antone Stocker, of Cudahy, Wis., Julia and Steve Hauch, currently living in The Philippines, An-nette McGee Rasch, of Cave Junction, and Gayle and Jeff Loiselle, of Dousman, Wis. Illinois Valley Funeral Home was in charge of ar-rangements.

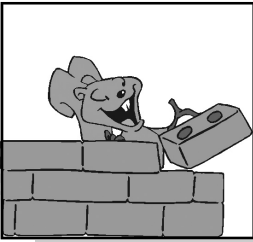
Free boat inspections Feb. 24

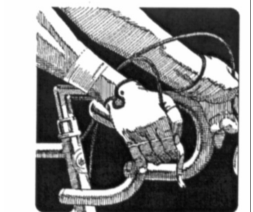
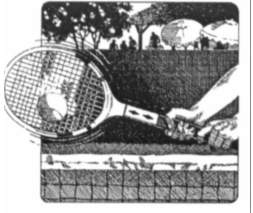
