

Informational session set for Junior Savings Program

It is with pleasure we announce to our community that the Junior Savings Program is alive and well for 16 years. Because of the participation of Lorna Byrne Middle School and Evergreen Elementary School, students to date have saved more than \$11,000.

In order to find what students thought about the value of money in their lives, we designed an essay contest in which we asked students to express their purpose for saving money. We have found that their ideas are much more healthy than some adults.

From two schools we had 12 essays entered and five in art. We are now in the process of selecting the winners.

Prizes will be awarded at the end of the school year in the sums of: first prize \$65, second \$45, third \$25. Art awards will be separate.

Guv wants marine reserves

The Oregon Ocean Policy Advisory Council (OPAC) has been instructed by Gov. Kulongoski in a letter to devise during the next year a state proposal for a network of marine reserves along the Oregon coastline.

Additionally. OPAC is to examine efforts to accommodate wave energy production and aquaculture in Oregon.

"It is essential that you develop and communicate a clear set of goals and objectives for creating a network of marine reserves along the Oregon coast," the governor wrote the council.

"I have watched with interest as the state of California has worked to create a system of marine protected areas," he wrote. "I think there is much to learn from that experience."

Memory class? Don't forget

Do you have trouble remembering names or dates?

Are your memory lapses worrying you? Should you be worried?

"Memory Difficulties: When You Don't Remember What You Forgot" is a class offering a comprehensive understanding of what happens to memory as people age. It will offer interesting and easy ways to manage memory problems, said Oregon State University Extension Service.

The class is scheduled for Monday, May 7 at 2 p.m. at Josephine County Extension Auditorium, 215 Ringuette St., Grants Pass. There is a \$5 fee. Phone 476-6613 to register.

The class teaches more than 40 tested tricks and techniques that can help maintain, and even dramatically improve, memory.

"I used to be scared there was something really wrong with me, because I was forgetting stuff

all the time; now I understand what's going on. I'm using those ideas I learned, and my memory is better than ever."

Sharon Johnson, of OSU Extension faculty, will teach the class. This presentation was awarded the 2005 American Society on Aging Mind Alert Award for innovation and program quality.
