On June 7, 1776, at a session of the Continental Congress, Richard Henry Lee, of Virginia, moved "that these united colonies are and of right ought to be free and independent states." ... June 4, 1805, land and naval campaigns waged by the United States forced Tripoli to negotiate peace ... June 4-7, 1942, the Battle of Midway handed Japan its first major defeat of World War II ... June 10, 1943, President Roosevelt signed the pay-as-you-go income tax bill; beginning July 1, wage-and-salary earners were subject to a paycheck withholding tax ... June 6, 1944, U.S. and Allied forces invaded Europe at Normandy in the greatest amphibious landing in history ... June 8, 1967, the USS "Liberty," an intelligence ship, was torpedoed by Israel in the Mediterranean in an apparent accident, killing 34 people ... June 5, 1968, Sen. Robert F. Kennedy (D-N.Y.), appearing at the Hotel Ambassador in Los Angeles to celebrate his California primary victory, was shot by Sirhan Sirhan and died a day later ... June 10, 1975, Vice President Nelson Rockefeller headed a panel which described illegal CIA operations ... June 6, 1984, former Vice President Walter Mondale won the Democratic presidential nomination and subsequently chose Rep. Geraldine Ferraro (D-N.Y.) as his running mate ... June 8, 1999, a New York City police officer involved in the 1997 torture and sodomizing of Haitian immigrant Abner Louima in a police station was convicted on an assault charge ... June 6, 2002, President Bush, in a televised address, proposed the creation of a cabinet-level Dept. of Homeland Security, combining 22 existing federal agencies charged with the responsibility of preventing terrorist attacks ... June 7, 2002, after four days of deliberation, a jury in Norwalk, Conn. convicted Kennedy cousin Michael Skakel, 41, of the 1975 murder of 15-year-old neighbor Martha Moxley ... June 10, 2002, the Justice Dept. said that it had thwarted a plot to explode a "dirty bomb" -- a conventional bomb with radioactive material added in that would be spread in an explosion -- within the United States.
