State gearing for its 150th

Preparations for the 150th anniversary of Oregon's admittance into the Union have been launched officially by Gov. Kulon-goski.

The celebration will begin Feb. 14, 2009 and last through fall '09.

"During 2009, Oregon will celebrate 150 years of statehood," said the governor.

"The sesquicentennial will be a unique opportunity to honor our past and all the people who created the quilt of natural beauty, urban and rural communities, diverse economy, and original thinking that we call Oregon," he said. "But just as important, our 150th birthday is a chance to look forward and share with each other our hopes and dreams for Oregon's future," he said.

To prepare for Oregon's 150th birthday, the governor established Oregon 150, a nonprofit organization. It is led by 30 "motivated citizens" from across the state who serve as its board of directors. The goal of this volunteer board is to inspire people across the state to remember, experience, and celebrate Oregon and, together, create a robust and sustainable future, Kulon-goski noted.

"This milestone birthday celebration should encourage Oregonians to explore the

fascinating history and rich bounty that makes our state so special," said Barbara Sidway of Baker City, newly elected president and chairman of Oregon 150.

The board's mission statement is supported by a strong set of values, including the assurance that Oregonians across the state of every age, income, and ethnic back-

ground participate in the sesquicentennial. Also, that it will contribute to the well-fare of Oregon through sustainable legacies in communities.

"Although the Oregon 150 Board will help guide critical program and funding decisions for our 2009 sesquicentennial, my vision is for community organizations, schools, town and tribal governments, and individual citizens on the local level to come up with ideas and plan celebrations that fit their needs," said Kulon-goski.

"Oregon's 150th birthday," he said, "should reflect the rich diversity and history that has shaped who we are today."

The full roster of the Oregon 150 Board is comprised of 29 citizen board members and 40 ex-officio members. For more information about the group, including the mission statement, visit oregon150.org.

*Yelling and "racing all over," people in a powerboat on Lake Selmac were causing a wakeful disturbance, said a caller near 11 p.m.

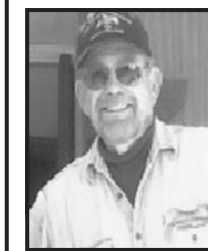
