Gary & Lisa Braden are the entrepreneurs behind the valley’s newest eatery, Subway -- and now its newest ice cream store. They use premium Dreyer’s products, and the 21 flavors available offer a good range of delicious, colorful choices.

As well, the soft serve “is really tasty,” said Gary.

He added that the intent

of Cups -N- Cones, in connection with the couple’s Subway eatery, is “to provide a nice, safe place for children and families. You can bring grandpa’ and granma’ and they’ll enjoy being here too,” he said.

“We want folks to come back again and again,” said Gary, “so we’re making Cups -N- Cones attractive with top-notch ice cream, plus courteous, attentive service in pleasant surroundings.”
