*A Jaguar, a motorhome and a van were found down an embankment with their license plates removed. The vehicles were on Galice Road between the Rainbow Recreation Site

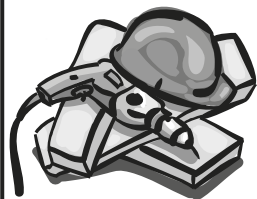
and Morrison's Lodge, and had been reported stolen.
