

Championship Little Leaguers need support

Financial help is needed for the Illinois Valley Little League team that took a state championship and participated last week in regional competition.

The I.V. Senior Team, comprised of 14- to 16-year-old boys, cinched its state title as Oregon Senior League victor in a 9-8 nail-biter vs. a Reynolds team from the Gresham area. That contest was in Keizer on July 24.

Earlier, the I.V. team had defeated the Reynolds team 9-7; the Tigard team 15-5; and the Parrish team 9-8. In the Eastern States Regional Championship Tournament in Salem the valley team lost its contests.

Expenses are estimated at \$10,000 -- leading to a request for donations of any amount to help bolster league finances. Valley businesses and individuals can donate for transportation, lodging and meal costs.

One recent morning at his home in the 3000 block he discovered that a \$200 windshield on his Chevy van had been smashed by an anonymous rock-thrower. The van was parked on his driveway, which is where the rock came from.

The next day, he found that someone had shattered a large side window on the same van.
