Fire damages Laughing Clam

Three fire engines were among responding emergency units to an arson fire behind Blind George’s that damaged the rear of The Laughing Clam restaurant in Grants Pass.

Some \$7,000 damage was caused to the building and contents, estimated Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety (GPDPS).

The blaze was reported Sunday, Oct. 7 at 8:34 p.m. as a dumpster fire behind Blind George’s. First units reported a fully involved dumpster with extension to

a storage area of the café.

GPDPS sent two engines, a battalion command vehicle and police units. Rural/Metro Fire Dept. sent an engine, and American Medical Response sent an ambulance. No injuries to civilians of firefighters were reported, said GPDPS.

Blind George’s remains open for regular business. However, the restaurant reopening date was unknown.

The cause of the fire was incendiary, reported GPDPS.

Liquor bucks in one month \$11.6 mil

The Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) sent \$610,266 to Douglas, Jackson, Josephine and Lane counties and their 37 incorporated cities as part of the July statewide distilled spirits revenue distribution of \$11.6 million.

Josephine County, population 81,125, received \$23,943. The city of Cave Junction got \$1,363; and the city of Grants Pass \$26,322.

Jackson County, population 198,615, was given \$58,618. And its cities received:

Ashland, \$18,237; Butte Falls, \$379; Central Point, \$14,086; Eagle Point, \$7,098; Gold Hill, \$919; Jacksonville, \$2,174; Medford, \$63,067; Phoenix, \$4,034; Rogue River, \$1,711; Shady Cove, \$2,349; Talent, \$5,459;

Other S.W. Oregon disbursements:

Douglas County, population 103,815/\$30,639; Canyonville \$1,366; Drain \$906; Elkton \$174; Glendale \$800; Myrtle Creek \$3,055; Oakland \$800; Reedsport \$3,617; Riddle \$889; Roseburg \$17,930; Sutherlin \$6,476; Winston \$4,674; Yoncalla; \$936.

Lane County, population 339,740,/\$100,269; Coburg, \$915; Cottage Grove, \$7,893; Creswell, \$3,872; Dunes City, \$1,145; Eugene, \$126,457; Florence, \$7,038; Junction City, \$4,236; Lowell, \$813; *Oakridge*, \$3,149; Springfield, \$48,564; Veneta, \$3,608; Westfir, \$285.

OLCC follows a per capita distribution formula based on Oregon’s population of 3.69 million. For July it was 29.5-cents per person for counties; 85-cents a person for cities.

The breakdown: 36 counties, 10 percent, \$1.09 million; 241 cities, 20 per-

cent, \$2.18 million; state general fund, 56 percent, \$6.1 million; city revenue-sharing account, 14 percent, \$1.52 million; state Addiction & Mental Health Division, \$694,962; and Oregon Wine Board (OWB), \$22,063.

OLCC revenue comes from the sale of distilled spirits in 241 liquor stores, and various beverage taxes.
