Marshal Jerry Schaeffer of Illinois Valley Fire District, and a solution has been reached.
Some 21 persons from organizations that could be affected attended the council meeting because of their concerns regarding usage of the kitchen. Many from the Cave Junction Lions Club attended, and there was representation from Illinois Valley Lions Club, Cave Junction Cares, and IVHS Alumni Association, among others.
It was noted that dona-

tions and pledges are coming from persons including Jim Frick, broker at Century 21 Harris & Taylor, I.V. Lions, and Joe Malcolm's Kar Kare. During the meeting a \$200 pledge was received from Joel Perkins of Outback Septic Service; and the alumni association indicated it could help too.
"It looks like we're well on our way," said Moore, who estimated total cost of equipment at less than \$2,000. He and others apparently will install the new equipment voluntarily, after

Moore obtains what he hopes will be some bargains during a Nov. 15 auction.
Moore said that Schaeffer agreed to allow CJ Cares to hold its annual Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners at the pavilion using the current hood and fan. But after that, the newer equipment must be installed.
The council also voted 5-0 on motions to adopt a program to prevent identify theft related to utility connections and billing; and to adopt Resolution 721, "Identity Theft Prevention Program."
The program is required by federal law, and must be in place by Nov. 1 for cities that operate utilities with water and sewer service.
Monday's meeting lasted only 18 minutes, but still missed by six minutes the shortest meeting that City Recorder Jim Polk can recall in his 16 years at the city.
Council, County Board Meet Before Session
Prior to the meeting, the council and mayor met for an hour in the nearby Josephine

County Bldg. for the monthly visit of the Board of County Commissioners.
One citizen in the form of Jim Frick attended the public gathering. A wide range of topics were included in general discussion, including the state of the economy.
Frick noted that housing sales are down throughout the county, with a large inventory on hand.
Dave Toler and Dwight Ellis, chairman and vice chairman of the county board, spoke about the Nov. 4 election and the proposed law enforcement districts. (Story on page 1).
The possibilities of Home Depot opening a store in Grants Pass, and Fields Home Center opening in Cave Junction were touched on. It also was noted that MasterBrands in Grants Pass laid off 104 employees on Friday, Oct. 24.
After nearly an hour of conversation, the meeting was adjourned. Frick thanked Toler and Ellis for their efforts for the county.

Cougar girls team heads for state X-country meet

The Illinois Valley girls cross country team took second place at the Skyline Conference championship event, qualifying for the state meet in Eugene on Saturday, Nov. 1.
The 5,000-meter Skyline event was held Saturday, Oct. 25 at Reinhart Volunteer Park in Grants Pass. I.V.'s Casey Robertson was named Skyline Runner of the Year.
Directed by coach Bill Yeoman, the Cougar girls earned 48 points, with Hidden Valley taking first with 37. The I.V. boys team score did not qualify for state.

State sniffing greenhouse gas

The Environmental Quality Commission voted unanimously last week to adopt reporting rules for greenhouse gas emissions.
The rules establish reporting criteria for Oregon businesses and industries to provide DEQ with accurate information about the amount of greenhouse gases they pro-

duce in Oregon annually.
DEQ said that it developed the greenhouse gas emission reporting requirements with help from an advisory committee representing a broad coalition of interest groups. The final rule is available on the DEQ Website at www.deq.state.or.us/aq/climate/rulemaking.htm.
