

When several cemetery items were brought into Cascade Metal Recycling in Grants Pass a year ago, one of the company's owners, Lynn Roemer, contacted police.

But Roemer didn't sit still. Instead, she contacted the Oregon Commission on Historic Cemeteries to locate the cemetery where the markers belonged. For her extra effort, the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office has given Roemer a Heritage Stewardship Recognition Certificate.

Gil referred Roemer to Jean Boling, a Josephine County historian and writer, and cemetery expert at the Josephine County Historical Society. Using burial records and photographs, she has confirmed that the items were from Laurel Cemetery in Cave Junction. Boling is in communication with Laurel contacts and the sheriff's office to resolve the legal issues and get the items back in place.

Added Kendell Phillips, a Cave Junction resident who serves on the Oregon Commission for Historic Cemeteries, "Cascade Metal Recycling really has set an exam-

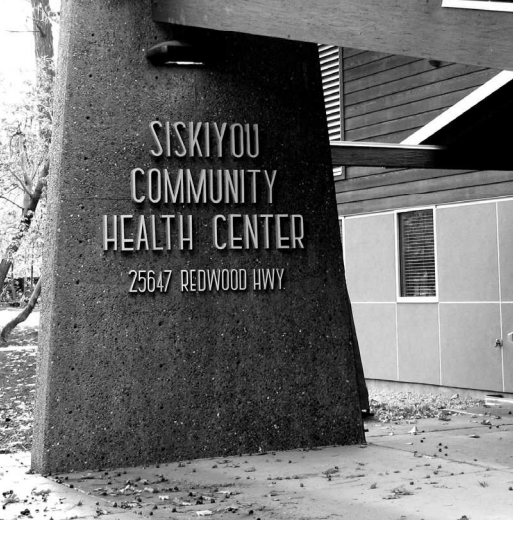
