

Josephine Community Libraries seeks I.V. branch supporters

teer and former library clerk, said. “That’s been the mission of JCLI since the very beginning.”
Naydol has helped establish a small fund-raising committee for the sake of devising a strategy for a local membership drive. The theme is the “I.V. 400,” because it is estimated that \$40,000 would be needed to open the Cave Junction branch of the library.
“In a valley with 30,000

people, if we had only 400 pledge \$10 per month, we’ll reach that budget and then some,” she said.
Naydol said that even though \$40,000 “might seem like a lot,” it used to cost the county around \$100,000 per year to operate the Cave Junction library.
“We really need to show JCLI that there’s solid backing and base of support for the library here in the Illinois Valley,” she said. “It’s really do or die. If the valley is go-

ing to have a library, we have to step up, take responsibility for it and make it happen.”
A mailing aimed at boosting membership recently was mailed, and a kick-off event was held at Taylor’s Country Store in Cave Junction on Thursday, April 16. Just under \$1,000 was raised that day, Naydol reported.
Displays have been put up at area businesses and banks, and Naydol plans to enlist the support of civic

groups such as the Rotary and Lions clubs. Membership and information tables will be set up regularly at Taylor’s and the Cave Junction post office, Naydol said, as well as during the Friday, May 8 ArtWalk.
The overall goal is to have the branch open before this summer.
Some challenges remain, however. Naydol said that the materials inside the library are outdated, as the building has been closed for almost two years.

“When the county left us, we didn’t have anything,” she said.
Naydol said that she is confident that those materials, such as magazines, can be obtained through sponsorships.
If there is enough support to open the Cave Junction library, JCLI plans to have a

display inside its foyer honoring the members who helped make the opening possible, she said.
