Wednesday, April 8

*A Selma resident complained of traffic speeding through a 20 mph zone on Lakeshore Drive. Extra patrol was requested, and one driver was warned about his goofy driving habits.

RADE raid nets meth, weed, guns and cash

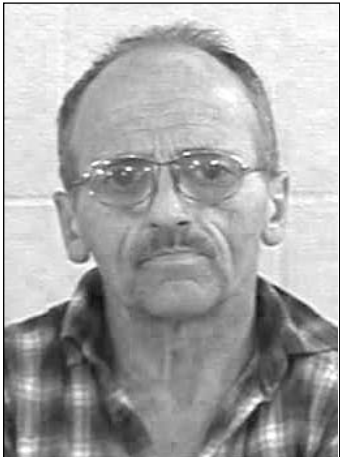
Detectives from the Rogue Area Drug Enforcement (RADE) interagency team arrested a Canadian believed to be here illegally, and cited him and a woman on numerous drug-related charges Tuesday, April 14 at approximately 2:30 p.m. in O’Brien.

RADE detectives, Oregon State Police troopers and a drug detection canine, and federal agents from the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) served a search warrant at 32429 Redwood Hwy., said OSP Sgt. Jim Johnson.

The address is the residence of Danny Lee Striegler, 52, the officer added.

Investigative efforts, he said, led to the seizure of marijuana plants, methamphetamine packaged for sale, loaded firearms, security devices, U.S. currency, and other evidence related to criminal activity. Striegler was arrested and lodged in Josephine County Jail on the following charges:

Unlawful possession, delivery and manufacture of a controlled substance, methamphetamine; and

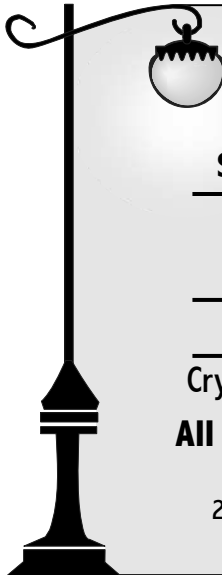

unlawful manufacture and possession of marijuana. ICE agents suspected Striegler of being in the United States illegally from Canada and placed a hold on him.

A woman on the property when the search warrant was executed, Bobbie L. Forsey, from O’Brien, was found in possession of methamphetamine. She was cited to appear in Josephine County Circuit Court on a charge of unlawful possession of a controlled substance, methamphetamine.

RADE is an interagency team comprised of detectives from OSP and Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety.
