Driver cited for DUI after Happy Camp wreck

Richard M. Jones, 45, of Cave Junction, was cited on a charge of driving under the influence of an intoxicant (DUI) following a motor vehicle accident in the 1600 block of Happy Camp Road Monday night, June 1.

According to Josephine County Sheriff's Office, deputies were called to the scene at 9:43 p.m. and arrived at 10:16

p.m. A 1980 Chevy pickup truck was reported to be on the roadway on its top with two occupants. The passenger, Raymond Mars, 16, exited the vehicle immediately, and Jones had to be extricated.

Extrication by Illinois Valley Fire District firefighters began at 10 p.m. Jones, 45, was removed from the vehicle and transported by American Medi-

cal Response to Three Rivers Community Hospital in Grants Pass. A blood draw later indicated that Jones had a blood-alcohol content of .21, said JCSO.

The scene was cleared at midnight. A large oil spill resulted from the wreck, and Josephine County Public Works Dept. was notified.

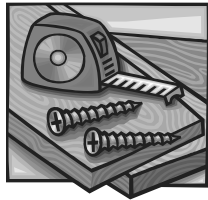
