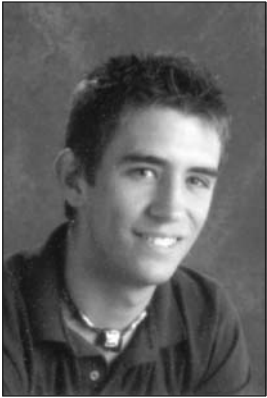
RCIV/Interact
