

\$65.3 mil budget for TRSD

A \$65.3 million budget with some staff reductions for the 2009-10 fiscal year was adopted 4-0 by the Three Rivers School District Board of Education during its Monday, June 15 meeting at the district office in Murphy.

Superintendent Dan Huber-Kantola said that the budget is mostly the same as the document approved by the Budget Committee during its May 27 meeting. But financial support from the state government was more

than expected, he said, which enabled the district to save five full-time equivalent classified positions, seven teaching positions and five school days.

However, Huber-Kantola said that the budget contains some staff reductions: 14 teaching and 16 nonteaching jobs, and one administrative position.

The 2008-09 adopted budget had a \$44.4 million general fund. The general fund for the proposed 2009-10 fiscal year budget was \$41.2 million, and the approved budget had a general

fund of \$41.5 million.

Included in the adopted 2009-10 budget are a \$43 million general fund, \$6 million in debt service, \$1.3 million for the district's self-insurance fund, \$13 million in special revenue funds, a \$1.8 million capital and carryover fund, and \$66,320 for the trust and agency scholarship fund.

The adopted 2009-10 budget is based on a tax rate of \$3.72 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. It was passed 4-0, as board member Phil Stephens was absent.

Ethanol bill now in Senate

The Oregon House of Representatives has passed HB 3177 to amend the state's ethanol mandate by allowing service stations to sell premium, higher-octane gasoline without ethanol.

House Republican Leader Bruce Hanna (R-Roseburg) and Rep. Tim Freeman (R-Roseburg) said that HB 3177 offers a common sense fix for certain classes of engines that don't operate well with ethanol-blended fuel.

"HB 3177 does not repeal the ethanol mandate, it simply gives service stations

the choice of selling un-blended premium fuel," said Freeman, an HB 3177 chief sponsor. "This bill is intended to help loggers, snowmobilers and fishermen who are allowed to use clear fuel but are having trouble accessing it because of the current law."

Hanna said HB 3177 is needed because few service stations currently sell un-blended fuel, making it difficult for Oregonians to purchase gas suitable for watercraft, ATVs and other special engines. He said that ethanol is also a public safety issue because it is known to cause engine fail-

ure in aircraft and boats.

"HB 3177 will help expand the market for Oregonians who depend on un-blended gasoline for their work and personal safety," said Hanna, an HB 3177 chief sponsor.

He added, "As the development and production of biofuels continue to evolve and improve, HB 3177 gives the state's renewable fuel standard an opportunity to work as it was originally intended."

HB 3177 has moved to the Senate Environment & Natural Resources Committee where it had a May 26 public hearing.
